Hoban recognized as Cleveland Clinic Banner School

Hoban has been named a 2019-20 Cleveland Clinic Banner School. The award recognizes Hoban as a noteworthy success in leveraging community resources to advance student learning.

"The effort Jason Dzik invested in implementing the Judging Innovation Program and the support you provided in the

process demonstrate an exceptional commitment to student enrichment and distinguish Archbishop Hoban High School as a 2019–20 Cleveland Clinic Banner School," Director of School Programs Bryan Pflaum stated in an email announcement.

Less than 24 percent of schools in 10 states that participate in the Cleveland Clinic K-12 Education School Programs are named Banner Schools. Cleveland Clinic K-12 Education offers school programs designed to promote health and wellness, academic achievement and career preparedness for students.



Akron Innovation Series funded by Educator Initiative Grant

Hoban and Jason Dzik were awarded an Educator Initiative Grant to fund a project called the Akron Innovation Series. This series will include a number of external events and competitions for local high school students to develop and practice key 21st century skills. The events will be sorted into three tracks (entrepreneurship, problem solving, and leadership) and will include opportunities for students to work directly with Akron business and community leaders. Expanded experiential learning and networking opportunities will drive the initiative.

Four students score well in National French contest

The National French Contest/Le Grand Concours is an annual competition sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of French. IPERC Host Families needed for international students

Dear Hoban Families,

IPERC is currently seeking host families for the 2020-21 school year and beyond. We have placed several students with Hoban families and are currently accepting new host family applications for our incoming international students.

To qualify, we ask that host families are able to provide students with their own room, all meals excluding school lunches, and preferably transportation to and from school and extra-curricular activities. Through hosting, families have the opportunity to learn about the customs and languages of another culture, as well as build lifelong bonds between the family and the student.

Families will receive a monthly stipend of \$1,000 for hosting.

We are offering the following opportunities for prospective IPERC host families:

Option 1: IPERC will provide tuition assistance to Hoban families who host an IPERC student. For each IPERC student hosted, your family will receive a one-time \$400 tuition reduction for the 2020-21 school year.

Option 2: For each IPERC student hosted by a Hoban Alumn, IPERC will provide a one-time \$300 tuition scholarship in your name, to a Hoban student in need of financial assistance.

Option 3: For each IPERC student hosted by a Hoban staff member, IPERC will provide a \$300 hosting bonus to the Hoban staff member.
