



## COVID-19 Policies & Procedures for Campers, Families, and Staff Summer 2020

### Staff and Facilities:

- Staff will practice social distancing and wear face coverings.
- All high-touch surfaces will be cleaned and disinfected throughout the day.
- Only materials that can be cleaned and sanitized will be in use, and item sharing will be limited.
- Each indoor camp space will be cleaned at the end of each session.

### Parents:

- Parents must complete a Summer Camp COVID-19 Risk Release Form prior to camp.
- Parents must screen children daily for symptoms including fever, chills, cough, headache, fatigue, nausea, or diarrhea, and complete a [Daily Health Form](#). A complete list of symptoms is available on the [CDC website](#).
- Drop-off and pick-up procedures will be conducted via vehicle ONLY. Detailed carpool instructions will be sent to registered families prior to each camp.

### Campers:

- Campers will be spaced 6 feet apart for activities, including meals and snacks.
- Outdoor times will be staggered.
- No large group activities will be planned, and time standing in line will be minimized.
- Wearing of face coverings will be required for all campers.
- Lunches and snacks will be provided in single-serve boxes, and beverages will be in individual bottles. Campers are encouraged to bring their own labeled water bottles to camp.
- Water fountains that are equipped with a hands-free hydration station may be used to refill water bottles.

### Everyone:

- Frequent handwashing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds will be required before entering a classroom, before meals or snacks, after outside time, after using the restroom, and prior to leaving for home.
- If soap and water are not readily available, all camps will have available hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Anyone showing symptoms of COVID-19 may not enter camp. If symptoms develop during camp, the person will be immediately isolated until he or she can leave campus.
- Campers, families, and staff will be reminded to avoid touching their eyes, nose, and mouth.

As COVID-19 information evolves, we will make modifications to our policies, as warranted.
