



Dear Parent/Carer,

We hope you are keeping safe and well.

No doubt you will have seen the updates on the news of a phased return to school in the coming months. All staff are working to put together a plan that will follow government guidelines whilst also attempting to maximise the effectiveness of this gradual reintegration of children back into an environment where they will see their peers again and return to some normality around the structure for their learning.



As a first step towards this, we are pleased to report that we now have email addresses set up for children to send in work from their home learning straight to their teachers. Following the phone calls made to each child over the last few weeks, this will provide further opportunity for children to communicate with their teachers and send in scanned copies or photos of their work that they are proud of and that teachers can feed back on.

Each class email address will contain the class name followed by the usual ending to our email addresses (for example: **robins**@wslprimaryacademy.org.uk, **swifts**@wslprimaryacademy.org.uk, etc). We are asking that children share 2-3 pieces of work each week with their teacher, combining both work they are proud of but also learning that children persevered hard with in order for them to receive their feedback.

Each week, one image will be selected by teachers to be shown in the weekly newsletter much like the 'Gold Award' that children would receive on a Friday in school. This will replace the format we currently have in showing images of work in the newsletter but will provide an effective opportunity for more work to be reviewed by the class teachers themselves.

Please note that these email addresses are for images of work to be sent to teachers for the purposes of sharing great work and receiving feedback on tasks. Any queries around other school business is to go through the usual channel of <u>office@wslprimaryacademy.org.uk</u>.
