

Dear Parent/Carer,

We hope you are keeping safe and well.

As we move towards our phased return next week, staff have been busy on the school site to ensure that all is prepared in regards to safety measures and the creation of engaging activities. Needless to say, the safety of the children is at the forefront of our minds to ensure that the transition back into learning for these year groups is both fun but also



provides less opportunity for children and parents to be anxious about the return to school.

Reception, Year 1 and children of key workers arriving at school from 8th June

You will have no doubt already seen through Parentmail that we have informed parents and carers of the protocols from the 8th June, including our procedures for when children are dropped off and collected from school.

We would like to summarise here the key points of our systems so that parents and carers of our Reception, Year 1 and key worker classes can refer to this as necessary:

- Children will be dropped off at the pedestrian gates that leads onto the school site from Harley Shute Road. At this point, a member of staff will direct your child to the appropriate teacher who will be waiting close by.
- There are two drop off times which are 8:50am and 9:00am. You will have been notified of your drop off time already through Parentmail.
- Children dropped off at 8:50am are to be collected at 2:30pm from the same gate.
- Children dropped off at 9:00am are to be collected at 2:50pm from the same gate.
- Based on the survey last term, if you answered 'maybe' or 'no' to your child attending from the 8th June and wish to change your mind, you will need to contact the school office to confirm a change in your decision. This will ensure that we have a clear understanding of numbers to maintain the safety of all children and staff on site.
- Please note that the school week runs from Monday to Thursday. There will be no school on a Friday.

Much like the information on the previous page, we wish to outline similar points for the year 6 children attending the St Leonards Academy:

- Children will be dropped off at the school gate that leads into the car park of the secondary academy. At this point, a member of staff will direct your child to the appropriate teacher who will be waiting close by.
- Children are to be dropped off at 8:40am and collected at 2:50pm from the same gate.
- Based on the survey last term, if you answered 'maybe' or 'no' to your child attending from the 8th June and wish to change your mind, you will need to contact the school office to confirm a change in your decision. This will ensure that we have a clear understanding of numbers to maintain the safety of all children and staff on site.
- Please note that the school week runs from Monday to Thursday. There will be no school on a Friday.
