





3. How comfortable are you returning to your school/workplace on a normal schedule?

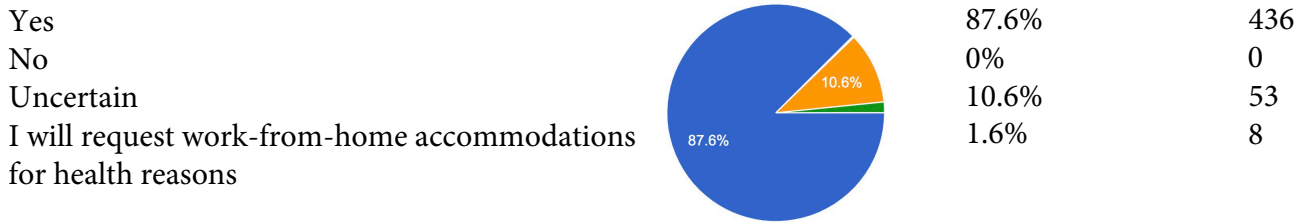

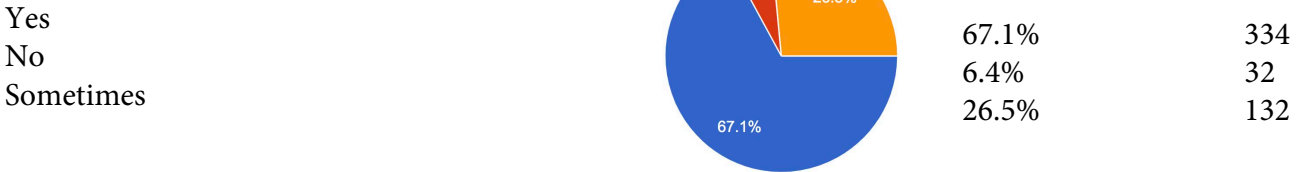
4. What factors would make you feel more comfortable? Check all that apply.

There is nothing that will make me feel comfortable	3.0%	15

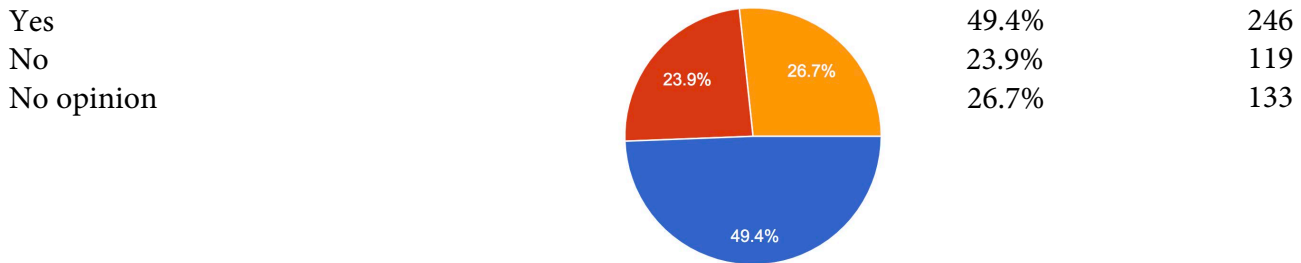
5. If school resumes in the fall, do you intend to return?



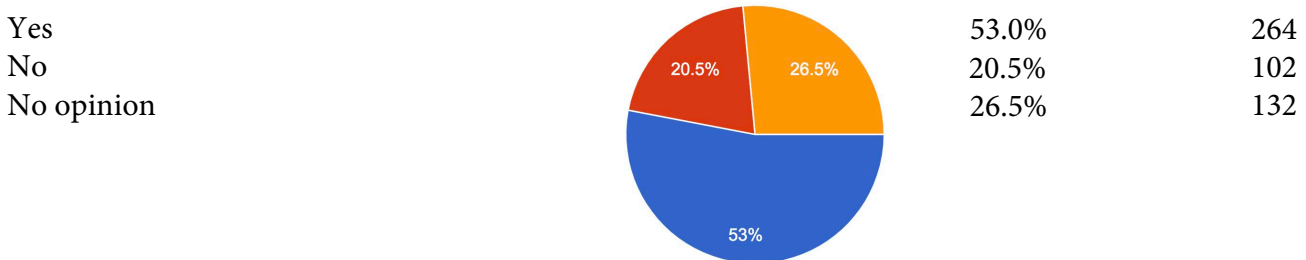
6. Would you be willing to wear a mask?

10. Please add any additional feedback/concerns about returning to school:

D155 should follow CDC guidelines/mandates from governing bodies

Masks inhibit the quality of in-person education and instruction

Social distancing among students in hallways/normal class sizes is difficult to achieve and monitor

Ready to return to normalcy with awareness of safety protocols

Concern for keeping at-risk/immuno-compromised family members safe

Concern for coordinating/providing childcare if D47 and other local school districts follow different schedules

Teachers require adequate time to prepare for online learning in the fall

Difficult to police students coming to school when sick/practicing proper hygiene

A blended style and altered daily schedule is preferred to allow smaller class sizes and in-person instruction
