DEAR friends,

We have just concluded the 2019-2020 school year, a year unlike any other in our collective memory or in our school's long history. I want to thank all members of our community for the creative, courageous, and compassionate approach to each other and this unprecedented situation. *Our mission, Inspiring students to become our creative, courageous, and compassionate future,* has never been more alive, and as we turn our attention fully to the 2020-2021 school year, we continue to be guided by this ambitious statement.

The purpose of this document is to outline the considered way in which we will make our decisions about how to re-open our campus. And while we cannot make definitive claims at this point given the variable nature of this public health situation, there are things we know now that we want to share.

We anticipate another communication in late July or early August with many more details as the status of the pandemic at that point and its subsequent impact on school will be much clearer. We will also host a series of divisional town halls in mid-August.

For now, we are preparing to teach in-person, to utilize the connected learning methods we developed through the latter part of this year, and to move back and forth as necessary to accommodate the needs of our community. In our uncertain environment, this planning is necessary. **I want to be very clear, though, that it is our intention to have as many students on campus as possible, with as full a range of programs and offerings as we can as soon as public health, medical science, and good judgement make it advisable to do so.** We are readying our campus to ensure appropriate social distance, and we are working on the procedures, schedules, and health monitoring, guided by the science and our many partner organizations, that will make this possible.

We know that the benefits of connected learning are more accessible for older students than younger students. These older students can most often make use of the technology independently and the nature of the work they are doing transitions more easily. **While we'd like to have all students on the campus all of the time, we will prioritize having younger students on campus first and most often if we cannot host each student each day**; we know that they benefit the most from the in-person experience that is so central to their learning how to learn and sets the foundation for their future schooling. No matter through what vehicle our learning happens, it will be personal and based in the relationships that are the hallmarks of the Elgin Academy experience. **To ensure this, we are planning to prioritize having all students on campus early in the year in order to establish and build the relationships that are crucial in any year at Elgin Academy.**

We also know that people will have varying levels of comfort with returning to campus. Each family's circumstance is different. **We are currently working on plans to make sure that the benefits of learning at Elgin Academy are available on campus and off.** An example of this might be to find a way for individuals from home to access live classes synchronously. We also have abundant faith in our use, where appropriate in certain disciplines, of asynchronous classes. Ultimately, our aim is to incorporate both, getting the mix right for each discipline and age.

On the pages that follow, you will find details about the many people on campus who are working to ensure a successful 2020-2021 school year. I am so grateful to these faculty, staff and community members who are volunteering their time to help us make the best decisions with the most recent information in this quickly changing situation. I am also so thankful to our entire faculty and staff, all of whom are working hard this summer to learn from the last few months and build on their successes to make 2020-2021 even better. Collectively, their hard work and expertise will allow us to analyze all of our options, react to the most recent information and, ultimately, set up the best and most adaptable plan.

I am confident in the program we will offer in 2020-2021 and look forward to working with you and your family. I can't wait to see you soon!


COMMUNICATIONS




The Hilltop Re-Opens

Elgin Academy will be prepared to resume a combination of in-person learning and hybrid learning while maintaining proper social distancing and health monitoring.

Our priority will be to have Early Childhood and Lower School students return to campus first.

Middle School and Upper School students could also return to campus, but may have a hybrid schedule that includes in-person and connected learning.

In the event that campus needs to close due to a case of COVID-19 on campus, new state and local mandates or a new stay-at-home order, students will transition to connected learning.



Connected Learning

Teaching and learning that takes place primarily in an online format. Connected Learning may include a mix of synchronous and asynchronous learning.

Synchronous Learning

Teaching and learning happens at appointed times where the teacher and students meet concurrently in connected formats.

Asynchronous Learning

Teaching and learning happens at varied times where teachers provide information and content that students can always access at different times.

Hybrid Learning

A mix of campus classroom and connected teaching and learning.
