### Assignment 3 - Renaissance Artwork and Themes

Much Renaissance artwork is seen as depicting the themes of **humanism**, **secularism**, **individualism**, and **naturalism**. These themes are not just important to understanding art, but are also indicative of broader historical trends over the last 600 years. These themes don't just shape art, but our modern world.

#### 1. Humanism.


# 2. Naturalism.

Naturalism refers to attempts to imitate nature in art. During the Renaissance, paintings and sculptures became more realistic. Perspective is used, and depictions of human anatomy become more accurate.



### 3. Individualism

Individualism is an outgrowth of humanism. It emphasizes human potential and achievement. Individualism focuses on the ability of individual people, rather than social classes or other traditional social structures (monarchies, the Church).



How does the painting of the *Mona Lisa* and the portrait of Lorenzo de' Medici demonstrate the theme of individualism?

#### 4. Secularism

Art during the Renaissance also became more secular. It became more focused on worldly things and less focused on Christian, religious subjects. It also became more sexual, with the development of poetry and art about love and lust. In general, art became more focused on the human world and less on religion. Despite this, most people were still devout Catholics and the Church still maintained power in society, but even the Church became more worldly.
