SLUH COACHING STAFF



Erwin Claggett – Varsity Head Coach

Erwin Claggett begins his 5th year as the basketball coach at SLUH. His coaching philosophy has the Jr. Bills playing an up-tempo style on offense, while using a pressuring defense. The excitement and enthusiasm that has filled the Danis Field House has set the foundation for what should prove to be another successful chapter in the annals of SLUH basketball. In 2015 Erwin led the Junior Bills to a 4th place finish in the state tournament. Last year, he led the Junior Bills to a 3rd place finish at State. In 2015, Claggett was named to the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. Erwin was an all-state player at Venice High School where he excelled at scoring and playmaking.

Claggett brings to the coaching position a list of credentials that includes success as a player and as a coach. On the high school court, Erwin in his senior year was the 1990-91 Metro East Player-of-the-Year at Venice, IL, where he averaged 24 points while leading his team to a 25-4 record. His high-game of 45 points came against East St. Louis. Nicknamed the "Venice Menace", Erwin's honors at Venice included All-Metro, All-State and a McDonald's All-America nominee. In his junior year, he averaged 23.4 points per game under Coach Clinton Harris, Jr.

On the college scene, Erwin played and graduated from St. Louis University. He is the Great Midwest Conference all-time leading scorer, named an Associated Press All-America in 1995 and inducted into the St. Louis University Hall of Fame in 2001. At SLU, Erwin is the #2 all-time scorer with 1,910 points, and he is #1 on the Billiken all-time 3-point goals made with 295. He also led the Bills to the NCAA Tournament twice. In 2015, Erwin was named to the Saint Louis University All-Century Billiken basketball team.

After college, Claggett played professionally in Europe. In 2003, he was named boys head basketball coach at McCluer. His squads compiled a record of 168-60, winning three conference titles. He was honored as the Suburban North Conference Coach-of-the-Year in 2004, 2006, and 2010. He also taught Social Studies at McCluer which he continues to do now at Backer Memorial.

Erwin and his wife, Trina, have two daughters, Erin and Taylor.





James Washington, Jr. – Associate Head Coach

A Sumner High graduate, James' coaching experience includes being the head basketball coach of the Gateway Tech boys where his teams won two district titles and one sectional championship. He has 10 years in education including 8 years as a physical education teacher in the St. Louis public school system. He also coached over 3 years in the military.

James has an Bachelor of Science degree in Sociology with a minor in social work which he received from University Missouri-St. Louis. Next spring, coach will earn his Masters' Degree in Physical Education. He and his wife, Wanda, are both Army veterans. They have one son, James III, who plays pro basketball in Sweden, and one daughter, Whitney, who is the associate girls basketball coach at Harris-Stowe State University.



Todd Basler – Associate Head Coach

Todd is a graduate of Valle High School in Sainte Genevieve. He earned his Bachelor of Science in Education from Southeast Missouri State. Todd received his Master's Degree in Education from Maryville University.

He currently teaches physical education at Ladue High School. He is in his 23rd year of athletics at Horton Watkins, including twelve years as the boys' head basketball coach where the Rams won two district titles and three conference championships.

Todd and his wife, Carol, have one daughter, Breland, and one son, Dane.

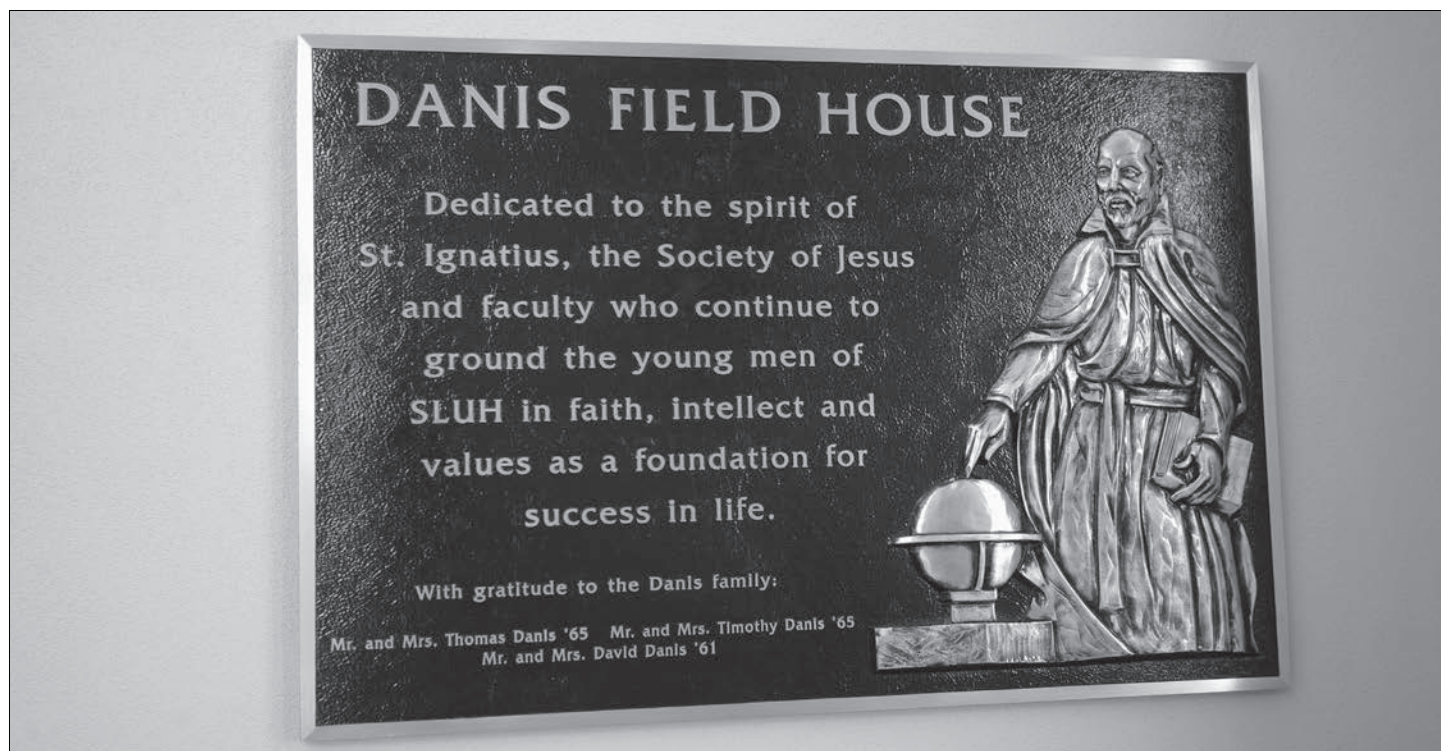

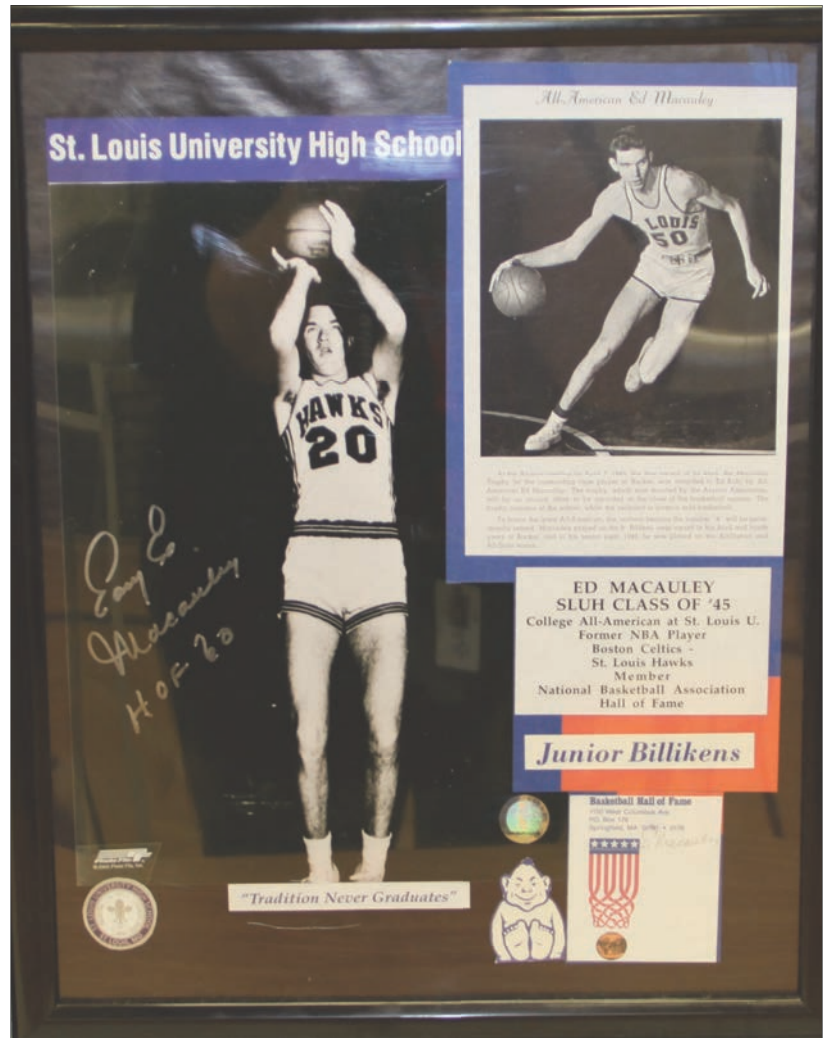

Junior Billikens and the National Basketball Association

Two Junior Bills have played professional basketball in the National Basketball Association.

Ed Macauley '45 played ten seasons in the NBA with the St. Louis Bombers, Boston Celtics and St. Louis Hawks. Ed scored over 11,000 points in his illustrious pro career. In 1960, he was elected to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts. The SLUH Alumni Association honored Ed by retiring his SLUH jersey number (#4).

Bob Nordmann '57 played four seasons in the NBA with the Cincinnati Royals, St. Louis Hawks, New York Knicks and Boston Celtics. Bob played 133 regular season games in his pro career. He scored 571 points and grabbed 517 rebounds.

Tom Kieffer '58 was drafted in the 9th round by Philadelphia in 1962. However, Tom did not play any NBA basketball.
