Philander Smith College's mission statement echoes its first mission by The Methodist Church to provide an education during "conflict and social change," by educating current students to become "advocates for social justice." The mission statement also is consistent with the current mission of The United Methodist Church by charging Philander Smith College students to "change the world for the better." As evidence of Church Relatedness, Philander Smith College offers weekly chapel services, curricular, and co-curricular activities to serve the spiritual needs of the campus community wherever possible.
