

TUSD 2020-2021 REOPENING SCHOOLS LEARNING MODELS

TUSD has made the decision to reopen all schools on August 11, 2020 to provide access to a public education for all students centered around rigor, relevance, and relationships with COVID-19 safety measures for students and staff. As COVID-19 guidelines change, TUSD will make adjustments, accordingly.

TUSD has plans to reopen all schools with a Traditional Learning Model, with COVID-19 safety measures in place, of which students attend school daily. If families prefer their children participate in an Independent Study Model, attending school 1 hour a week, please contact the TUSD Educational Services Department. TUSD COVID-19 safety measures are based on guidance from the San Joaquin County Office of Education (SJCOE), California Department of Education (CDE), San Joaquin County Public Health Department Officer, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).
