English ~ Poetry

We explored writing in a different form: poetry. We read a selection of limericks by **Edward Lear**, noting any patterns and rhyme, and nonsense words. We then compared these to his famous rhyme, **The Owl and the**

Pussycat. We chose sections we particularly liked to learn and recite.
