

ESD Proposed School Model for 2020-2021





Bring All Students Back K-12 Full Time

- Five days a week
- Access to Chromebooks as needed
- Physical distancing: six foot promoted to the extent possible
- Enhanced cleaning and safety protocols
- Face coverings required (pot. exceptions by Dr. Larson)
- Elementary classrooms: stay together at recess.
- Materials will not be shared.
- Social and emotional supports in place



Hybrid: Students Attend Two days: Online Three Days

- Five days per week.
- Blended model: both in-person (2 days) and remote learning (3 days)
- Students with Individual Education Plans (IEPs) may attend daily, dependent upon the IEP team decision.
- Reduced number of students in the classroom; allows for more physical distancing
- While on campus, students will adhere to all in-person learning experience protocols: masks and social distancing, etc.
- All students will have access to a district-provided Chromebook, as needed.
- May participate in extracurricular activities and follow safety guidelines
- Social and emotional supports in place



Virtual Academy: Online Learning Possible Choice for All Families

- Five days a week or hours equal to this time period.
- All students will have access to a district-provided Chromebook.
- Students will experience a high-quality online purchased curriculum through ESD Distance Learning/Virtual Academy Program (K-12).
- Social and emotional supports in place
- May participate in extracurricular activities and follow safety guidelines
- The special education team will work with families to schedule required in-person therapies, including tele- therapy when appropriate.



ESD Process

Facilitated nine focus groups with over 200 stakeholders to ask for their input concerning the reopening of schools for next year. These groups included:

- June 9: Two student focus groups, one group with special education parents.
- June15: Three focus groups: Two with elementary and then secondary staff and one with our Spanish speaking parents.
- June 16: Two focus groups: one with elementary parents and then one with secondary parents.
- June18: Two focus groups with special education parents.
- On June 17th: Committee meeting with over 70 stakeholders (parents, students, staff)
- Online Survey opened for all staff and parents: opened June 19th closed June 23rd

Major Challenges With Models

Bring All Students Back:

- Mask wearing by students all day, five days a week
- Six Foot Distancing: especially during lunches
- Cleaning routines

Hybrid Model:

- Childcare for working parents during the three days of stay at home online time for students
- Need for streamlining and improving the distance learning model
- Less time for students to be in school





Recommendation

I. Start the 2020-2021 school year with a Hybrid Model and continue with this model until the end of first quarter.

Advantages:

- Time to adjust to social distancing and mask wearing, cleaning routines
- District will see number of families choosing the virtual academy experience.
- Allows time for potential changes in requirements from the CDC

II. Starting Second Quarter: Assuming that Dr. Mark Larson approves the overall social distancing possible in various classrooms and lunches, bring all students back every day.

- Students will have had opportunities to practice procedures like mask wearing and physical distancing during the previous hybrid time period and may better adjust to adhering to these protocols on a daily basis.
- More continuity of instruction and peer/social interactions and connections with staff
- May need to keep some schools on a Hybrid model if not able to meet social distancing requirements





Recommendations (Continued)

ESD Virtual Academy: Online and includes extra curricular

- Any family could choose this model, ideally for one semester.
- Changes requested before the end of the semester would be considered on a case by case basis by building administrators.

Students on Individual Education Plans (IEPs):

- Students who have Individual Education Plans (IEPs) may attend daily, dependent upon the IEP team decision. (For both Hybrid and Virtual Academy).
- The special education team will work with families to schedule required in-person therapies, including tele- therapy when appropriate.
