- Writing and Rhetoric: narratives, dialogue & description in character development, comprehension, summarizing text, describing for detail, vocabulary in context, comparing & contrasting point of view
- Compose three-point paragraphs, descriptive paragraphs, and persuasive paragraphs
- Research and write a three and five paragraph report
- Compose cordial letters, business letters, and thank-you letters
- Practice summarizing information on a topic
- Compose different forms of poetry

- Identify symbols, natural images and objects used to create artworks
- Understand and apply ways of showing depth
- Recognize that light, distance, relative size and motion affect the appearance of objects
