#### **ENHANCED TRADITIONAL PLAN**

Traditional school with enhanced health and safety precautions.

# SOCIAL DISTANCING / HYBRID PLAN

Combines online and face-toface instruction for students with increased safety & disinfecting measures.

#### **FULL DISTANCE LEARNING PLAN**

Instruction provided through distance learning with continued standard pacing of material, interactive lessons, graded assignments and assessments.

\*As determined by state and local officials and the Governor's Executive Orders. As these orders change, we could potentially move in and out of these scenarios throughout the 2020/2021 school year.
