All District residents are automatically enrolled in their home middle school. All residents should have received a letter welcoming them to their home middle school in December.



Home address determines school placement


Families interested in attending a middle school other than their home school need to complete an Intradistrict Transfer Request and return it to the District Office by **February 14, 2020.**



ENROLLMENT TIMELINE

DECEMBER – Families received "Welcome Letter" from their home middle school.

FEBRUARY – Intradistrict transfer request forms <u>due February 14th</u>.

MARCH/APRIL – Middle school counselors visit elementary school campuses to facilitate welcome presentations with fifth grade students. Students will come home with a registration card to indicate preference in their elective choice for sixth grade.

MAY – Middle school hosts school socials on campus to allow sixth grade students to meet and greet staff and tour the campus. All enrolled students will be invited and will receive an email reminder.

JUNE/JULY – Families receive an email from their middle school providing them with information to log into AERIES and complete the registration process.

2-Period Core



6th Grade Electives



- <u>Exploratory Wheel</u>: Visual Art, Drama, Music,
 Engineering/Robotics/STEM, etc. (9-week rotations change year-to-year. Gives students exposure to multiple courses)
- Choir: (Year-Long Elective) Beginning choir for both boys and girls
- Instrumental Music: (Year-Long Elective) Band, Orchestra and Jazz
 Band (Auditions for advanced sections in Spring of 2020)
- STEM I: (Year-Long Elective) An introduction to coding, engineering and robotics. (This class isn't a pre-requisite for STEM II/III)

6th Grade Only: Option for an 8-period day for students who want to take the wheel and a music elective.



Physical Education

- 6th/7th Grade Students in Same Period
- Focus on the CA State Standards for Physical Education
- Students are required to "dress out" for class each day
 - PE uniforms can be purchased on Registration Day (Late July)
- □ Students receive a separate PE Locker
 - PE Lockers & Locks are given out to students during the first week of school



Elementary: 70-90 min/day = 12,600 -16,200 min/year

Middle School: 45 min/day = 8,100 min/year

High School: 55 min/day = 9,900 min/year

Self-Efficacy = The belief in one's capabilities to achieve a goal or outcome.

MOTIVATION

The desire or willingness to do something

LEARNING

The acquisition of knowledge or skills

SELF-REGULATION

The ability to attend, control emotions and manage thinking, behavior and feelings


ACHIEVEMENT


