

The Big Picture With Fr. Bob



Dear Friends,

In C.S. Lewis' book entitled "The Four Loves," he has a chapter devoted to friendship. In that chapter, he quotes Jesus at the Last Supper, "You did not choose Me, but I chose you, and appointed you, that you should go and bear fruit, fruit that will last."

C.S. Lewis makes the point that, in our

relationships, it is Jesus who first chose us for one another. He explains that timing and distance are factors that might have kept us from having met someone. The school, the neighborhood, the workplace, all play into our having met someone.

Back twenty-five years ago, at the time of my ordination to the priesthood, I had no idea which priests I would serve with as an associate pastor or as a pastor. I would have been very surprised if someone had pointed out a little six-year-old and said, "Twenty-five years from now, you two are going to be serving together as priests."

God is full of surprises and I am very grateful that the Lord chose Fr. Matt and I to work together at Divine Child at this time!

Part of saying "yes" to following Jesus is saying "yes" to being open and available to the mission, which is much bigger than me and my ideals. As I sit down to write this final bulletin article, there is some reluctance and sadness in my heart. I realize that I am called to make myself as available as possible to the mission that Jesus called me to in and through the Church. However, it is much more difficult to say "yes" to that mission now that I have come to know and love so many of you here at Divine Child. I feel like I have been spoiled in my first few years of priesthood in being here. Not that there wasn't lots of necessary hard work, sacrifice and conversion on my part but being here at this parish has been such a blessing to me over the past three years. The biggest blessing to me in being here has been the warm, welcoming and holy parishioners and staff who have welcomed me into their lives. I have been moved to humility and gratitude countless times in seeing the faith alive in your hearts through many Masses, Confessions, individual meetings, visiting classrooms, teaching opportunities and just in visiting with people as I see them here or in the community.

Jesus, in calling His apostles, tells them to "take nothing for your journey." While I still look with fear and reluctance at all the stuff that I need to pack and bring to my new parish, the openness for the mission is essential for all of us who desire to follow Jesus. It is essential to have a strong sense of detachment to be available to go wherever Jesus leads us. For me now, that includes the call from the Archbishop to go to St. Lawrence Parish as the new Associate Pastor. In detachment and obedience to the Lord's will, we are set free from anxieties or concerns about how we should organize or structure our lives on our own. It seems contradictory but this is a real freedom. As priests, we can have complete confidence of the Lord's will for us whenever we say "yes" to the call of the bishop.

As I say good-bye to all of you, it is with profound gratitude to each and every one of you. You have made my first years of priesthood such a tremendous joy. I have heard it said that a priest never forgets his "first love" of his first parish as a priest. While normally I would be able to thank many of you in person, the current circumstances don't make that possible. You all will definitely be in my heart and mind for the rest of my life.

I want to thank the many people who work here at our parish and school. Divine Child Parish and schools are such fertile ground for the Gospel to continue to be sown and lived. So many of you are faithful disciples eager to share the Good News and serve the Lord through the parishioners and students that you come in contact with. May the love of God continue to shine through your ministry! I also want to thank the two pastors who have been my first models of priesthood, Fr. Jim Bilot and Fr. Bob McCabe. They are both heroic and holy men who have shown me how to be a priest. Thank you!

Please keep me in your prayers as I move to St. Lawrence and know of my prayers for all of you!

PHASE 1: A PLAN FOR Safely RETURNING TO MASS

Dear parishioners - It is with joy in our hearts that we share Divine Child resumed public Masses on Tuesday, May 19, 2020. In alignment with the liturgical directives issued by Archbishop Allen Vigneron, we are committed to providing a safe and clean environment for the faithful to worship our Lord. The health of our parishioners is of utmost importance to us and new procedures and protocols have been put in place to ensure this. Please review the information below regarding how Mass will work and the role we all play in keeping each other safe. Thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation as we work through our new "normal" together. Note: Dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass is granted to all faithful through Sunday, Sept. 6, 2020. Let us keep each other in our prayers. - Fr. Bob McCabe & Fr. Matthew Hood

SECTION 1: WHO SHOULD ATTEND MASS

According to the Archbishop's directives, parish churches are <u>not</u> to exceed <u>25% of their total capacity</u> at one time - that's <u>375 parishioners</u> at Divine Child. This means we must count the number of attendees at each Mass, and we must turn attendees away when we reach capacity. We believe all people who desire to worship our Lord should have the ability to do so. *See Section 2 for how we are working to ensure all can worship.*



WHO SHOULD NOT ATTEND MASS

- Those who are older than 65 years old (the recommended CDC age), with a compromised heath condition or caring for the sick in any way, are encouraged to stay home.
- Anyone who is ill, has a temperature, cough, etc., should stay home as an act of justice to the whole community.

SIGN UP FOR TEXT ALERTS!

To receive real-time text messages regarding when the church reaches its maximum capacity and cancellations of outdoor Masses due to weather, simply text the keyword DivineChild to 84576. **INDOOR MASSES** We are returning to our normal weekday and weekend Mass schedule. All parishioners must enter the church through the front doors (Silvery Lane). Only 375 people will be admitted at once, and an attendant will be keeping count at the door. Attendees beyond that will be asked to proceed to the corresponding outdoor Mass at 10:15 AM or 12:45 PM, or to watch the weekend's streamed Mass.

OUTDOOR MASSES Weather permitting, we will be <u>adding</u> <u>two outdoor Sunday Masses at 10:15 AM & 12:45 PM on</u> <u>the football field</u>. Attendees may enter the football field through the gateway building, through the North-West gate from the elementary school lot, or through the South-East gate. Attendees will be seated on the field facing the home bleachers. <u>Those who attend the outdoor</u> <u>Masses are encouraged to bring lawn chairs or a blanket</u>. No seating will be provided. You may also consider bringing a hand-held umbrella for shade. Don't foget your sunscreen! * Note: Outdoor Mass cancellations due to weather will be communicated to parishioners by 7AM via text, social media and email. Face-coverings are not required for outdoor Masses.

LIVE STREAMED MASS For those unable to attend Mass in-person, the weekend live stream will continue, but is <u>moving to</u> <u>Saturday's 4:30 PM Mass</u>. Watch the Mass in real-time or any time retroactively by visiting <u>Facebook.com/DivineChildParish/Live</u>.

FACE MASKS

All parishioners MUST wear a face mask as recommended by the CDC (except those under 2 years old) to obtain entry into all Masses.



SOCIAL DISTANCING

All attendees must maintain 6 feet of distance between themselves and others not in their household.



HAND SANITIZER

Parishioners are encouraged to bring and use hand sanitizer before & after Mass. We will also have 4 hand sanitizing stations located in the gathering space.



SANITIZING THE CHURCH

A deep sanitization of the church pews, doors, restrooms, etc. will be conducted after each weekday Mass and after the completion of Sunday liturgies. The church cannot be deep cleaned between Sunday Masses, and therefore, it is important to follow the color/letter seating chart for each Mass.



PLASMA GENERATOR

A plasma generator has been installed on the church HVAC system. The device breaks d<u>own and</u> destroys viruses, bacteria and mold by charging the air with positive & negative ions.

SECTION 3: HOW MASS WILL WORK

FINDING A SEAT | To ensure proper social distancing and sanitizing of pews, parishioners will be asked to adhere to a seating chart for each Mass. Pews will be marked with alternating color coded letters. Please sit in these colored/ lettered pews for the following Mass times. Attendants will also be present to assist parishioners.

WEEKDAY MASSES:

6:30 AM - Orange/A pews only 8:30 AM - Yellow/B pews only

SATURDAY MASSES:

8:30 AM - Orange/A pews only 4:30 PM - Yellow/B pews only

SUNDAY MASSES:

8 AM - Orange/A pews only 10 AM - Yellow/B pews only 12:30 PM - Green/C pews

OUTDOOR MASSES:

Please sit on or near the ten yard lines in order to provide adequate social distancing. Orange cones will be placed along each ten yard line to mark the amount of space to the front and back of attendees. Those who attend the outdoor Mass are encouraged to bring lawn chairs or a blanket. No seating will be provided. You may also consider bringing a hand-held umbrella for shade.

OFFERTORY There will not be a collection during Mass. Upon the conclusion of Mass, please place your offertory in the collection baskets located in front of the altar, in the gathering space or at any exit of the football field. Alternatively, donations can be made online through FaithDirect.net, or mailed to/ dropped off at the rectory (1055 N. Silvery Lane, Dearborn, MI 48128).

COMMUNION A limited number of Eucharistic ministers will be on hand for each Mass to distribute communion to multiple pew banks/yard lines. Thank you in advance for your patience as we expect communion to take longer than usual. Communion procedures will be explained just before the reception of the Holy Eucharist. If you wish to receive the Eucharist, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Attendees should maintain 6 feet of distance from other attendees while proceeding to the front of church/field.
- All attendees should remove masks and gloves as they approach the minister. No gloves may be worn when receiving the Eucharist in hand.
- Attendees should bow and reply "Amen" at a distance of 6 feet from the Eucharistic minister and then approach to receive the Eucharist.

For your safety, if a Eucharistic minister accidentally touches the hand or mouth of a parishioner, he or she will sanitize his or her hands instantly with rubbing alcohol at a sanitizing station located near each Eucharistic minister's station.

* If you are uncomfortable receiving the Eucharist at this time, please know that there is no obligation to receive the Eucharist whenever you come to Mass.

CONFESSIONS AVAILABLE

Private confessions will continue to be held from 2-4 PM on Saturdays under the three church awnings (located in front of the adoration chapel and on either side of the gathering space). Faithful are asked to line up in front of the main church entrance (adjacent with Silvery Lane), while waiting for one of the priests' stations to open up.

A SWAN'S SONG AS THE TORCH IS PASSED

Five years ago, when I was elected Grand Knight, I never knew where we would go as a council. We were still housed in the basement of St. Clement Church in East Dearborn. Our membership meeting comprised of maybe ten to twelve members which included the officers. There were not many events or programs, we just seemed to be existing to exist. Within the year we were forced to vacate the premise because the parish was closing. We had a matter of weeks to find a place to meet. We moved furniture and supplies and unloaded things we were no longer going to use. We quickly found a home at the Polish Catholic Church on Beech Daly. We had a one-year lease. During that time, our membership began to grow, and we achieved Star Council for the first time. Our Council won the State Youth Program Award for our Chess Tournament and we saw more members want to join our council. Six months into our lease, Fr. Jim approached me about becoming a parish-based council. It took a good 5 months to make it come together and in July 2017 we held our first meeting at Divine Child Parish. Since then we have grown together increasing membership, increasing visibility, and growing in faith and brotherhood. Since being here at Divine Child working together, we achieved Double Star Council Award 2 years in a row, and even with the world seemingly turned upside down, we will achieve Star Council for this year.

Awards are great and together we worked hard to achieve them, but what our council has accomplished goes far beyond awards and is far more gratifying. I watched as our council not only grew in membership, but in fraternal unity. Our Catholic faith is the one common bond that makes us brothers. The men of this council have worked side by side at Fish Frys, Chess Tournaments, Garage Sales, Free Throw Contests, Christmas Parties and gathered socially to build our fraternity. It is most likely that before becoming a Knight, you did not know the man that worked next to you during an event. These are men you began to know and appreciate who they were and where they came from. I genuinely think, that when we see a brother Foley Knight at Mass...we somehow feel and recognize the fraternal bond that makes us Knights of Columbus. That my brothers is the greatest reward I have received...to look around the church, to look around our meeting space, to look around the community and see brother knights who I consider my brothers in charity, unity, fraternity, patriotism and most significantly FAITH.

As a father is proud of his family, I am so proud of all we have done together, side by side as a brothers of the Bishop Foley Council. Together by our witness and example, we have grown this council from its all-time low of about 126 members back in 2015 to nearly 190 men today. I am not naïve to believe that times were always perfect. There were surely times when I was short with some of my Foley Brothers and brothers from other councils. I may not have had time to deal with a problem properly or did not give you the answers you were looking to hear. Sometimes it got stressful, even for me...especially during the uncertain times when we were planning the Fish Frys. Some say being a Grand Knight for five years is too long, I agree! A three-year term would have been ideal, but with two moves and a new pastor I felt the responsibility to see the council through the transitions. Although stressful at times for me, I hope for the membership, the transitions were seamless. There was also the fact that no one was stepping forward to take the reins. Fortunately, Steve Lentz has agreed to lead the council for the next few years. I have the utmost confidence in Steve and the team he has put together, I know you will support him the way all of you have supported me these past five years.

My brothers, my friends - thank you for all you have done for this council and for allowing me to lead you as your Grand Knight. God bless all of you and our council. As my term of Grand Knight expires at the end of the month and my attention is turned to new responsibilities, the pen of Foley's Forum will pass to the new Grand Knight...so as I sign off, I bid you all -VIVAT JESUS!

Meet Our Extended Family:

Sts. Peter and Paul, Apostles (Feast Day June 29) FIRST CENTURY

Aside from Jesus, Peter and Paul are the most significant characters in the New Testament. The New Testament clearly shows Peter as the leader of the apostles, chosen by Jesus to have a special relationship with him. With James and John, he was privileged to witness the Transfiguration, the raising of a dead child to life, and the agony in Gethsemane. His mother-in-law was cured by Jesus. He was sent with John to prepare for the last Passover before Jesus' death. Jesus appointed Peter the first Pope when he told him, "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." (MT 16:18-19)

Paul was dedicated to persecuting the early disciples of Jesus in the area of Jerusalem prior to his conversion. After his dramatic encounter with Christ on the road to Damascus, Paul traveled all over Asia Minor to proclaim Christ to the Gentiles. He founded numerous churches in Asia Minor and Europe, and took advantage of his status as both a Jew and a Roman citizen to minister to both Jewish and Roman audiences. Thirteen of the twenty-seven books of the New Testament are attributed to Paul.

Saints who fought racism

Pope John Paul II called racism a plague, its manifestation in the United States "one of the most persistent and destructive evils of the nation."

For the millions who experience racism, it can be encouraging to get to know Saints who were also targets of abuse, disdain, and even murder because of their race; ugly as some of these stories are, they remind you that you are not alone. For those of us who are trying to walk in solidarity with people of color, the stories of the Saints invite us to work harder to fight against racism in the Church and in the world.

Venerable Teresa Chikaba (1676-1748) was, like St. Josephine Bakhita, kidnapped and sold into slavery as a child (though Chikaba was from Ghana). Though relatively well-treated in the home of her noble Spanish mistress, Chikaba remained an enslaved person. She endured the dehumanizing nature of slavery as well as the racist taunts and beatings at the hands of other servants in the household. Freed after the death of her mistress,



Chikaba was turned away by one convent after another, despite her enormous dowry and the patronage of her former master the marquis. When she was finally allowed to enter a Dominican convent, she was made to live as a servant rather than a full-fledged nun, even after she became a mystic and a miracle-worker. A poet, Chikaba was the first black woman known to have written literature in a European language.

Blessed Peter Kibe (1587-1639) was

a **Japanese** Christian who felt called to be a Jesuit priest. He was refused entry to the Jesuit order in Japan and eventually went to Portuguese Macao. There, he was told he couldn't be ordained because he was Japanese. He went to Goa, where he was told they wouldn't ordain any Asians at all. Rather than wash his hands of the whole racist affair, Kibe trusted in what he knew of the Catholic Church (and the Jesuit



order) and traveled to Rome, a journey that included 3,700 miles on foot. There, he was finally received into the Society of Jesus and ordained, after which he spent eight years traveling back to Japan to serve as an undercover priest before his martyrdom.
