



Update for Cambridge schools on June 2020 series

To Cambridge International schools worldwide,

Thank you again for submitting your centre's predicted grades and rank orders. Our Chief Executive Christine Özden and our regional teams have put together a video to thank you all, which can be viewed on our [website](#).

Now that the Grade Submission System is closed, we wanted to focus our update today on the support we are providing for teaching and learning when school is closed.

We also have more information on university applications and further updates to our FAQs on marks in the November 2020 series and percentage uniform marks (PUMs). We have decided to move our communications on our statistical standardisation to a later update.

We will send our next update to schools on 2 July 2020.

Applying to university

Universities worldwide are continuing to give assurances that they will accept grades from Cambridge International in the June 2020 series in the same way as previous series.

You can find more information about university admission policies in the [statements of support](#) document on our website, which we have updated this week. It includes six new statements from universities in Canada, including McGill, which lists Cambridge International A Level as an accepted qualification eligible for credit.

Our Global Recognitions team has held several webinars recently with universities in popular study destinations to provide reassurance to schools and students about university applications. We plan to add the recordings to our website soon and will keep you updated.

Updates to our FAQs

Our [updated FAQs are here](#). Below are some of the key updates:

Will candidate grades or candidate marks be used to calculate Cambridge International A Level results in the November 2020 series?

Marks from our assessments provide the most reliable and valid measure of a candidate's performance. We will use any AS Level marks relevant to the candidate's entry option to calculate their A Level result, in preference to using the A2 only option*. This includes AS Level marks from the June 2019 series for candidates entering staged 'June carry-forward' options. This is an exception to our usual 13-month rule for carrying forward marks.

We will soon be providing more detailed information about carry forwards on our website.

* The A2 only option is only available to candidates entering a 'June carry forward' option in the November 2020 series and who had a valid AS Level entry in the June 2020 series.

Will Cambridge International A Level candidates receive a PUM (percentage uniform mark) in the November 2020 series if candidates in their region usually do so?

Candidates completing their full A Level in the November 2020 series should be aware that PUMs will not be available under the 'A2-only' route. The A2-only route is available to candidates entering for the 'June carry-forward' option for the syllabus who have no relevant AS marks from the June 2019 series. If a candidate needs their PUM, they should enter for the linear A Level option.

Will June 2020 question papers be available online for centres who didn't receive them?

We plan to make June 2020 question papers and mark schemes available on the School Support Hub to support learning and revision. No candidate sat exams in the June 2020 series and this means there will be some differences in the materials we can share with you for these question papers.

We will inform centres when the June 2020 question papers become available on the School Support Hub.
