SLUH wins 4重 ti

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. -The SLUH cross country team did something Saturday at the Missouri High School Activities Association Cross Country Championships in Jefferson City that they have not done in almost 40 years.

The Junior Billikens won the Class 4A boys championship by

one point against Liberty for their first cross country

championship since 1961

"We have come up here so many times and had such high hopes so many times that I don't know what to feel," SLUH coach Jim Linhares said. "I am numb. I am so deeply satisfied I can't put it into words."

After coaching cross country

at SLUH for 17 years, this was the pinnacle of Linhares' coaching career.

The top finisher for SLUH on the day was Ted Snodgrass who came in 19th place. Nathan Trower, Murphy O'Brien and Dan Westlund also finished strong for the Junior Billikens. All three finished in the top 40.

"It was such a team race," Linhares said. "We had a couple individuals who did not have the race they would have ideally wanted, but no one of them crumpled. That was the secret.

Even Tim Huegerich, our number five runner who literally crumpled at the finish line and is getting an IV now, held up through the finish and that is what made the difference. It was such a team effort."

CBC was close behind SLUH finishing in third place just six points out of first place.

"They ran beautifully. I was just so pumped about how smart they ran," CBC coach Gaylerd Quigley said. "They stuck to the game plan completely. They did exactly what they needed to do We talked about having three guys in the top 30, and that is where they were. And we talked about a second pack with our 4th and 5th guys in the top 60, and that is where they were. They all just did a great job. To be just six points out of 1st place is just incredible."
