SLUH unhappy with third place

It's a funny thing about standards. The better you become, the more you have to do to impress yourself.

A few years ago, St. Louis University High would have considered a third-place performance at sectionals to be a cause worth celebrating. But after the fine 1993 season the Junior Bills have enjoyed, the third-place finish at the Class 4A sectionals was a slightly bitter disappointment.

"It just wasn't our day," Coach Jim Linhares said. "We haven't had a day where we went sloppy until today."

Webster Groves won the meet with a score of 61 points. Parkway South followed at 87 and SLUH was third with 89.

Of the day's competition, SLUH expected only Webster Groves to pose a real challenge.

"We were looking past sectionals because we knew we'd qualify," Linhares said, "but we weren't looking past Webster Groves because they

were right there in front of us."

Junior Pat Hamel, who has been at the forefront of what may turn out to be SLUH's best season ever, again led the Junior Bills on Saturday. Hamel finished ninth with a time of 16 minutes, 55 seconds.

SLUH also got strong runs out of Kevin Myers, who was 14th, and Ray Griner, who finished 24th.

Mehlville is sending two runners to state this year. Senior Matt Jacobs was 10th, with a time of 16:58, and sophomore Nathan James was 20th with a time of 17:98. In Class 4A, the top 25 finishers at sectionals qualify for the state finals.

As a team, the Panthers finished sixth with 128 points.

"This meet was hard to figure," Mehlville coach Bill Zimmerman said. "We thought we'd be anywhere from second to eighth. We knew that anything could happen."

Zimmerman said the Panthers' season was successful.

"We had a good year," Zimmerman said. The kids would have liked to see the whole team go to state, but there's no bitter disappointment."
