# SLUH breaks post-season jinx, gets 3rd

**Junior Billikens** finish 1st among St. Louis squads

Let's put it into perspective:
The last time that the St.
Louis University High crosssountry team had a better season than this, John F. Kennedy
was in the White House.
In 1961, SLUH won the state
title, and for the 36 years that
followed, no team finished
higher than eighth at the state
championships.

That all changed Saturday, when the 1997 vintage Junior Bills capped off a first-rate season by finishing third over-all in the Missouri Class 4A

competition.

Lee's Summit was first with 118 points; Jefferson City was second with 141; and SLUH was third with 155.

The performance breaks a post-season jinx that has plagued SLUH for the last few

years.
"We've been on the short end sometimes, so this was great," said coach Jim Lin-hares.

Linhares said he had a gut feeling that this was going to be the year.
"I really felt good this week," Linhares said. "In years past I felt anxious. This year, I knew they had this race inside them."

SLUH managed to do it with

SLUH managed to do it with a team strong on consistency, but lacking a "superstar" runner. A solid pack with no true weak spots set the stage.
Senior Ben Rosario was SLUH's sole medalist, finishing 18th in 16 minutes, 46.03 seconds. Medals were awarded to the top 25 this year, rather than the previous years' top 15.

Senior John Christie was the cond SLUH finisher in 39th

place.
"He ran the kind of race
that has been successful for
him all year," Linhares said.
"He went out hard."

Christie's time of 17:04 was a testament to just how tough the competition was this year.
"Usually," Linhares pointed out, "Seventeen minutes is all-state — when they were only giving out medals to the top 15. This race was faster by 15 places."
Third man, junior Ken Reichert, was also key in the performance.

"Ken was a real hero," Linhares said. "He moved up amazingly in the last mile."

Sophomores Ted Snodgrass and Murphy O'Brien handled the stress of state's circus-like atmosphere.

"They came through," Linhares said. "It's almost inevitable at state that you aren't going to have an ideal day, whether it's in the head or the body. You need guys who can come through and these guys did."
