POSSIBLE LEADERSHIP PROJECT IDEAS

Share the Warmth: A winter gear drive was run for Richfield's elementary schools in order to gather winter items for children during recess. Members will be making posters, cutting out flyers, and decorating several collection bins.

Stuffing styrofoam, not turkey: Chapter members formed an assembly line to prepare more than 350 meals to deliver to members of the community at Thanksgiving.

Wood for warmth: To make certain that the elderly in the community had wood for their fireplaces this winter, members collaborated with a local church to purchase, split, load, and deliver cords of wood.

Sharing Santa: Children were treated to an afternoon of games, crafts, a movie, and a visit with Santa thanks to the fundraiser sponsored by NHS. Parents paid a fee to the chapter for their children to participate and the funds raised provided food and gifts for a local needy family.
