

Family Survey Results

1. We had 540 responses. We have about 1900 students. 65% of the responses were from parents with elementary students.
2. Almost 80% of parents were either “comfortable with minimal or no concerns” or “comfortable with concerns”. About 20% of respondents were either “somewhat comfortable” or “not at all comfortable having their student return to school”.
3. What factors would make you feel more comfortable with coming back to school in the fall?
 - Following the Department of Health Guidelines 24%
 - Symptom checks of employees required 41%
 - Symptom checks of student required 38%
 - Face coverings required 15%
 - Classrooms and gatherings spaces cleaned and sanitized 65%
 - Sanitizing supplies, including hand sanitizers readily available 67%
 - Maintaining social distancing protocols 22%
 - A hybrid model that allows students to participate in both in person and remote online learning 28%
 - There is nothing that will make me feel comfortable 4%
 - I am comfortable with return to in person instruction 58%
4. Primary concerns about coming back to school:
 - Regulations not being followed 18%
 - Classrooms and other gathering places not being properly disinfected 28%
 - Availability of disinfecting materials or PPE’s 18%
 - Concern about child wearing a mask at school 57%
 - Childcare 8%
 - Readjustment to classroom and school life 19%
 - Transportation 9%
 - Having in person interactions with others 16%
 - Other or no concern 47%
5. Comments in the survey ranged from “run school as normal” to “we won’t be sending our child back to school until there is a vaccine”; and from “we won’t send our child to school if face coverings are required” to “we won’t send our child to school unless face coverings are required”.
