Luna shines at Sectionals, Qualifies for State

The Harriers stumbled in the climatic State Sectional Meet last Saturday morning at Souix Passage Park, failing to qualify for the State race as a team. Yet there was one bright spot, as Mickey Luna qualified to run as an individual in the State Meet.

Souix Passage is known across the state as a tough course of many hills, including the infamous "Man-Maker." The competition was also very tough, as the Jr. Bills took on about sixteen other teams and twenty individuals.

The Harriers ran a quick first mile, staying up with the pack and recording a swift 5:15. The second mile of the course is the toughest, slowing down many of the 130 runners and spreading them out. Unfortunately, the second mile also took its toll on the SLUH contingent, slowed by the steep course.

The third mile includes the "Man-Maker" but most of the Harriers were able to attack it quite well, keeping their form all the way up. However, the Harriers had been hurt by their second mile and failed to get the finishes needed to qualify for State.

Mickey Luna ran a faster time than he had in the Jr. Bills previous running on the Souix Passage Park, and qualified as an individual for the State Meet. The rest of the SLUH team failed to qualify, but turned in some good finishes.

Following Mickey was Angelo Directo, Jerry Kester, John Sadlo, Jammie Cummings and freshman Shawn Halley. All of the Harriers ran tough races and though they failed to qualify for State, they cut over thirty seconds off of their time.

The team now looks forward to a strong race next year, as none of the team will be graduating. Yet first they hope to see Luna turn in an impressive finish at State, a race that will give valuable experience no matter what the outcome.
