### App of the week: **123 Kids Fun Music**



A colourful, engaging and simple music game for EYFS and Nursery children which inspires and encourages children to create their own music. It is a great first step to explore the world of music and sounds. The game has 25 different instruments to explore creativity to help improve motor skills and help the appreciation of sounds and music. A great way to have independent musical fun.



### Website of the week: **Team Tutti**



Team Tutti is a self-guided learning experience using animated characters to deliver fun and engaging lesson content whilst promoting a deep dive into musical composition and technology.

A series of weekly lessons deliver a combination of musical concepts, creative challenges to encourage the implementation of new skills and an interactive quiz to assess learning.

The scheme begins with an introduction to Team Tutti and a series of tutorials explaining how to use the platform and its features.

As the lessons progress the content becomes more challenging. Children can take advantage of the interactive features including videos, animations, audio buttons and the sketchpad sequencer to deliver new and exciting music topics.

Weekly lessons discuss musical concepts including...rhythm, tempo, texture, timbre, harmony, melody, pitch, dynamics, structure and musical notation.

**Traditional Tales from BBC Bitesize**

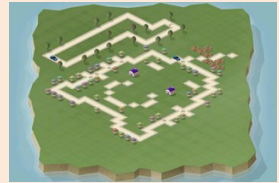


The songs and music activities in Traditional Tales are inspired by three stories from around the world: Tiddalik the Frog (an Aboriginal story from Australia); Lakshmi and the Clever Washerwoman (a traditional Hindu story from India) and Anansi and the Moss-Covered Rock (an Afro-Caribbean folk-tale). The resources for each story include songs to learn - with presenters Andy Day and Rebecca Keatley of CBeebies; animations of the story; music activities based on the music for the song; listening music to appraise and a wealth of activity sheets to print.

**Isle of Tune**



Create your own island of music on the Isle of Tune website. The Isle of Tune website is a musical sequencer with a twist. Begin by laying down some road. Start to add houses, plants and lamp posts to your road (or a combination of these). Place a car on the road and press go! As the car drives past each element on the road it will create a rhythmic or melodic sound. At the end of the road the car turns around and plays your composition in retrograde!

**How to sing, rap and beatbox**



Learn about how the voice can be used in different ways and different styles including singing, rap and beatboxing. Listen to the vocal styles of Plan B, Vince Staples and the Soweto Gospel Choir. Find out how to protect and train your voice.

The voice is a personal instrument and no two voices sound the same. Using the voice is an important form of communication, both in spoken word and music.

Throughout the history of music, the voice has been used to communicate a variety of ideas as a means of personal expression. Vocal performances are also used to entertain in opera, musicals, concerts and many other types of shows.
