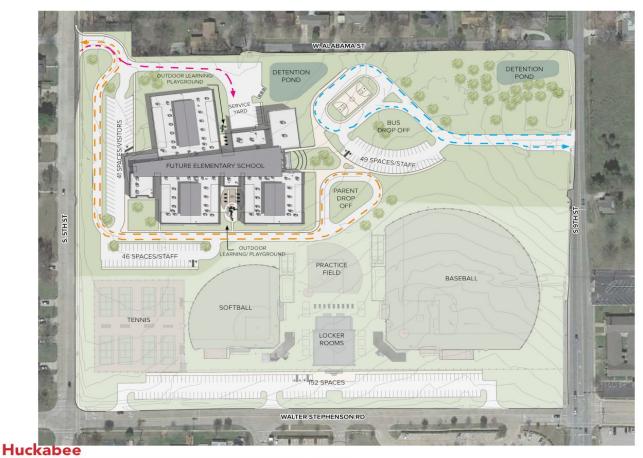

Irvin Floor Plan





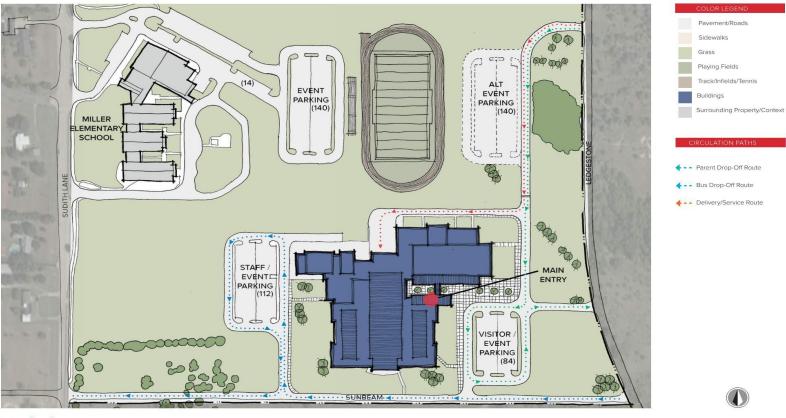

Introduction

On Nov 8th, 2016 Midlothian ISD passed a bond election for \$268m for Technology, Security and Capital needs, Growth Management Projects, and Athletic and Sports Fields Renovations.

The next facility to be designed is the New Middle School by Huckabee Architects, to relieve Walnut Grove and Frank Seale Middle School population growth. The campus will be located on an approximately 50 acre site adjacent LaRue Miller Elemventary School, bounded by Sudith Lane and the future Ledgestone Drive.





Planning Approach

On May 19, 2017 Huckabee started the planning process by hosting a day long planning session at our Waco office located on the Baylor University campus, BRIC Facility (Baylor Research and Innovative Collaborative). The session was attended by a diverse group of MISD staff, administrators, and citizens of Midlothian.

In an effort to understand MISD's goals for their new campus, the team participated in a Q&A discussion where they explored the answers to 3 questions;

- What does future ready really mean?
- If their future is different than it was 10 years ago, how do we prepare for that future?
- If our expectations for students are different, how should the role of the educator change?



Answers were varied as the team centered on discussions about the need to be flexible, collaborative, making connections to real life experiences, making learning personal, and seeing the educator as a facilitator.

The District's goals are as follows;

- 1. Provide facilities that create an
- innovative learning environment.2. Provide safe, engaging, rigorous and diverse learning environments.
- Provide appropriate resources for high quality staff to promote student
- Promote problem solving, critical thinking, and risk taking for staff and students.
- Collaborate with stakeholders and community partners to meet the needs of the District.



The New Middle School planning effort focused on the development of the Ed Specs on Aug 29, 2017 where the Planning and Design team met with Middle School instructors from each department including Science, Fine Arts, Special Education, Physical Education, and Library Services. During that day long meeting, instructors were able to convey their goals for the new Middle School regarding their specific learning environments, collaboration areas, specialized classrooms and support spaces, administrative offices and organization and furniture and equipment needs of each space.

Huckabee then conducted a two day design charrette on October 3rd and 4th, where MISD personnel were able to have direct input into the conceptual design of the Middle School in regard to adjacency, overall form, building siting and site development, and programmatic verification.

On Nov 15th, 2017 the Middle School team toured Wagner MS in Georgetown to experience first-hand the collaboration and learning environments solutions at that campus. That visit informed some of the decisions made in regard to organization of the classroom wings and administration and media center, which have been reflected in follow up design review meetings in November and December.

MS #3 Schematic Design Phase



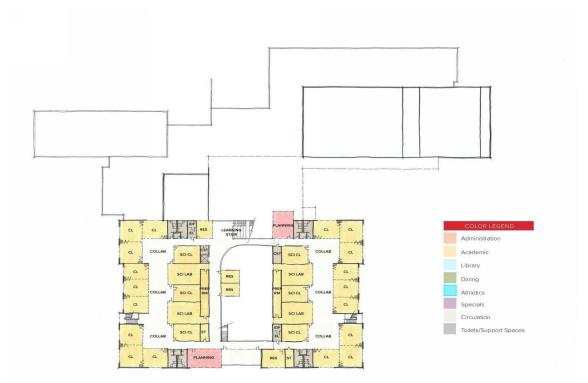
MS #3 First Floor Plan







MS #3 Second Floor Plan





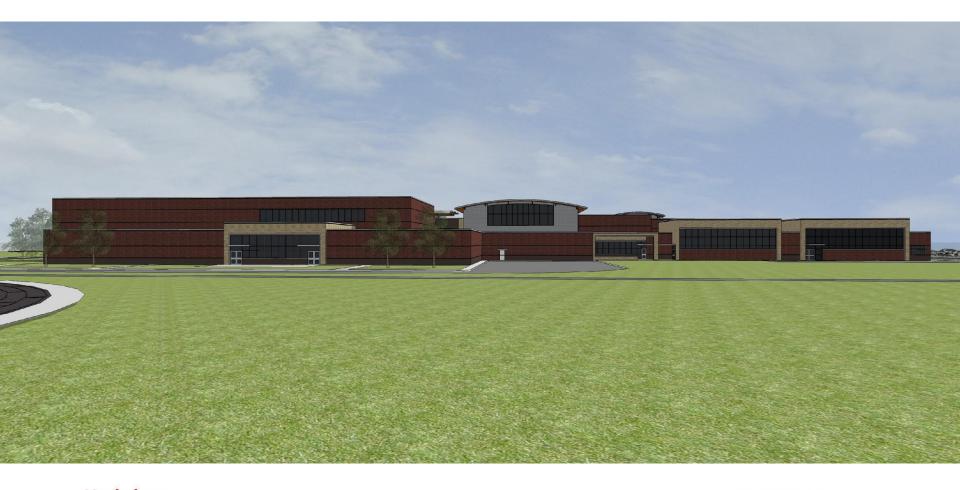

 - MHS plastic laminate covering, unused locker removal to create space for student collaboration
 - LB, MP, JAV paint refresh of striping in corridors, cafeteria, library, upstairs, and stairwells
 - Determine budgetary amounts based on student capacity at each campus
 - MHS, FSMS, WGMS, MP, Baxter, LB, JAV, Miller

February 27-28

- Existing Campus Cultural Tenets Teams of 10 met for ½ a day (MHS, WGMS, FSMS, Baxter, LB, MP, Miller, JAV)
- Cultural Tenets were reviewed and campus teams were given budgets, floor plans, and workspace of instructional questions around innovative and flexible learning spaces.

March

Campus flexible furniture orders submitted for board approval.

April

 Campus principals and their teams continue to determine construction renovation needs to present to administration for Phase 2 of construction renovations.

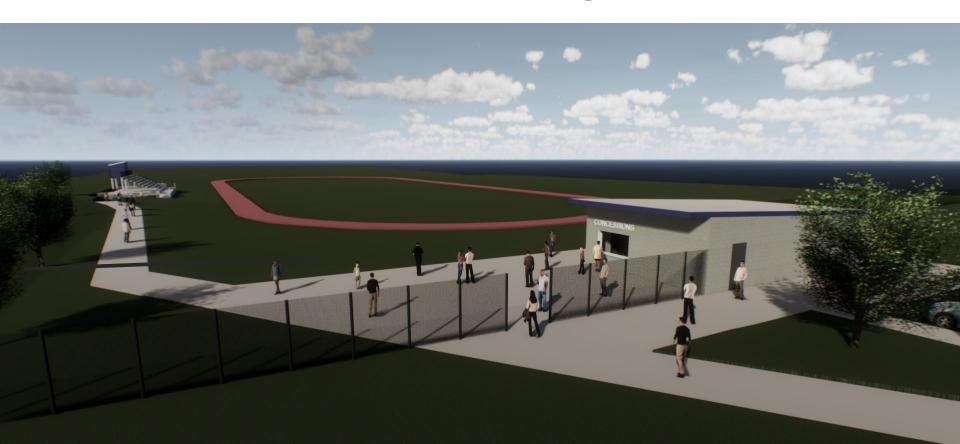

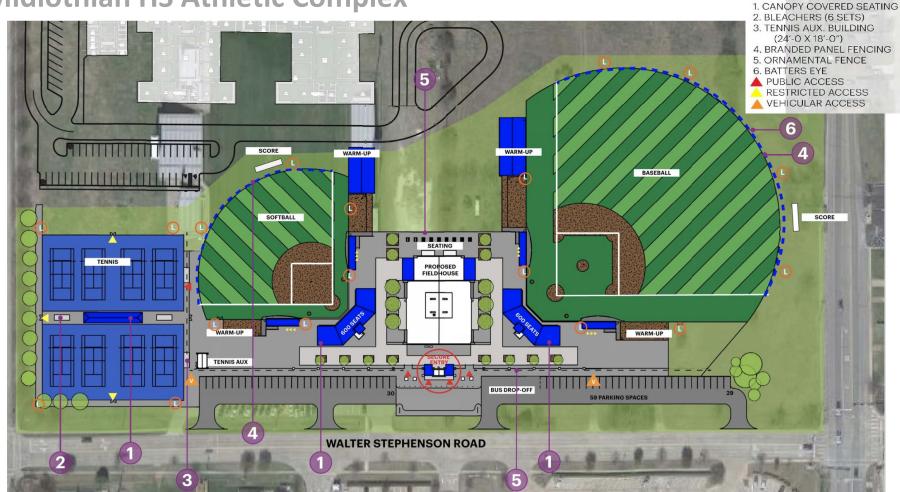

Midlothian HS Athletic Complex - Scheduled Completion February 2019

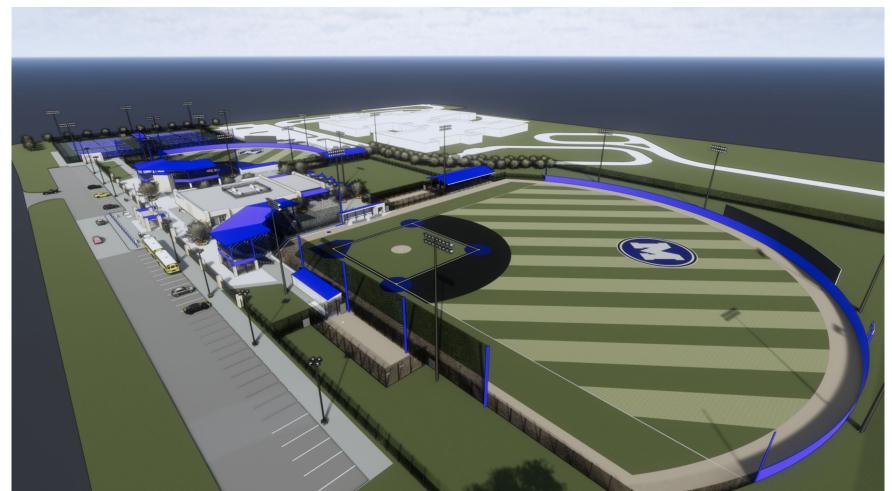

Financial Updates

Series 2018 Bond Sale

February 15, 2018

- \$80M in fixed rate bonds with 30-year maturity offered to investors
- Moody's and S&P had rated the bonds as "AAA/A1" and "AAA/A+"
 - Moody's: Sizeable tax base with recent strong growth, above average wealth and income levels, strong financial position (i.e. general operating fund balance) resulting from strong management and conservative budgeting practices.
 - S&P: Very strong wealth and income levels, maintenance of very strong finances and "good" management practices.

Series 2018 Bond Sale

- There was significant interest in MISD bonds as 18 investors submitted orders of \$1M or more
- Orders of \$144,585,000 were submitted during the order period
- Bonds sold at a premium over par value with an interest rate of 4.07%
- Proceeds will be deposited to MISD investment account on March 8
- Proceeds will be used to fund MS#3 and MHS Field House

Voters in Midlothian ISD approved the November 9, 2016 bond package with 58 percent voting in favor of the referendum. 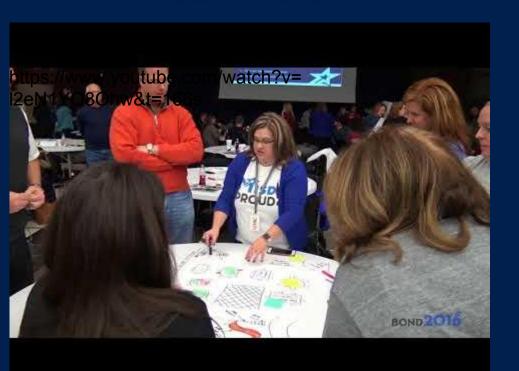
