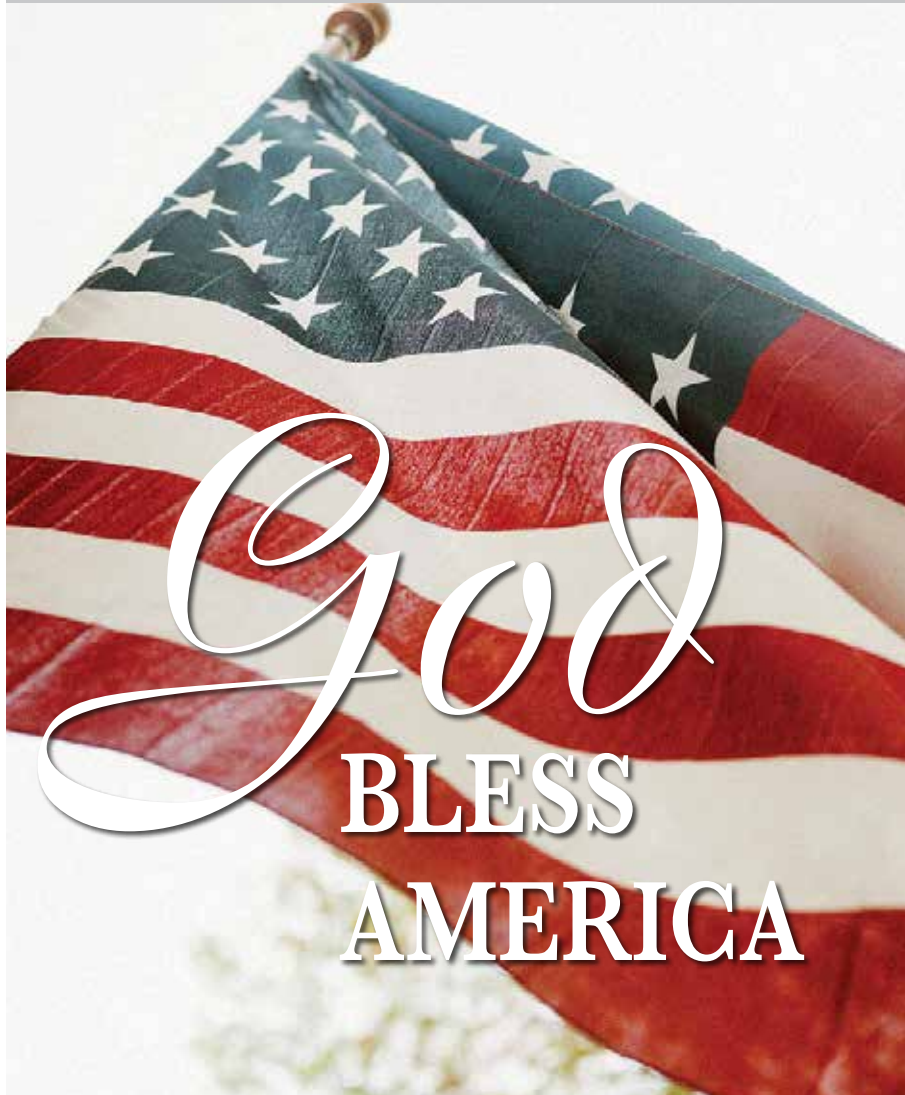

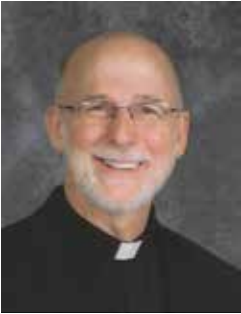
In the case of an emergency, such as anointing of the sick or funeral preparations, please call the rectory and select the appropriate prompt. Your message will be given first priority and returned promptly.

Dear Parishioners of Divine Child,

PHASE 1: A PLAN FOR *Safety* **RETURNING TO MASS**

Dear parishioners - It is with joy in our hearts that we share Divine Child resumed public Masses on Tuesday, May 19, 2020. In alignment with the liturgical directives issued by Archbishop Allen Vigneron, we are committed to providing a safe and clean environment for the faithful to worship our Lord. The health of our parishioners is of utmost importance to us and new procedures and protocols have been put in place to ensure this. Please review the information below regarding how Mass will work and the role we all play in keeping each other safe. Thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation as we work through our new "normal" together. **Note: Dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass is granted to all faithful through Sunday, Sept. 6, 2020.** Let us keep each other in our prayers. - Fr. Bob McCabe

SECTION 1: WHO SHOULD ATTEND MASS

According to the Archbishop's directives, parish churches are not to exceed **25% of their total capacity** at one time - that's **375 parishioners** at Divine Child. This means we must count the number of attendees at each Mass, and we must turn attendees away when we reach capacity. We believe all people who desire to worship our Lord should have the ability to do so. *See Section 2 for how we are working to ensure all can worship.*

SIGN UP FOR TEXT ALERTS!

To receive real-time text messages regarding when the church reaches its maximum capacity and cancellations of outdoor Masses due to weather, simply text the keyword **DivineChild** to **84576**.

INDOOR MASSES | We are returning to our normal weekday and weekend Mass schedule. All parishioners must enter the church through the front doors (Silvery Lane). Only 375 people will be admitted at once, and an attendant will be keeping count at the door. Attendees beyond that will be asked to proceed to the corresponding outdoor Mass at 10:15 AM or 12:45 PM, or to watch the weekend's streamed Mass.

OUTDOOR MASSES | Weather permitting, we will be **adding two outdoor Sunday Masses at 10:15 AM & 12:45 PM on the football field**. Attendees may enter the football field through the gateway building, through the North-West gate from the elementary school lot, or through the South-East gate. Attendees will be seated on the field facing the home bleachers. Those who attend the outdoor Masses are encouraged to bring lawn chairs or a blanket. No seating will be provided. You may also consider bringing a hand-held umbrella for shade. Don't forget your sunscreen! Face-coverings are not required at outdoor Masses as long as social distancing is maintained. *Note: *Outdoor Mass cancellations due to weather will be communicated to parishioners by 7AM via text, social media and email.*

LIVE STREAMED MASS | For those unable to attend Mass in-person, the weekend live stream will continue, but is **moving to Saturday's 4:30 PM Mass**. SAFETY GUIDELINES & EXPECTATIONS

*Measures we're taking to
keep our community safe*



FACE MASKS

All parishioners **MUST** wear a face mask as recommended by the CDC (except those under 2 years old) to obtain entry into all Masses.



SOCIAL DISTANCING

All attendees must maintain 6 feet of distance between themselves and others not in their household.



HAND SANITIZER

Parishioners are encouraged to bring and use hand sanitizer before & after Mass. We will also have 4 hand sanitizing stations located in the gathering space.



SANITIZING THE CHURCH

A deep sanitization of the church pews, doors, restrooms, etc. will be conducted after each weekday Mass and after the completion of Sunday liturgies. The church cannot be deep cleaned between Sunday Masses, and therefore, it is important to follow the color/letter seating chart for each Mass.



PLASMA GENERATOR

A plasma generator has been installed on the church HVAC system. The device breaks down and destroys viruses, bacteria and mold by charging the air with positive & negative ions.

SECTION 3: HOW MASS WILL WORK

FINDING A SEAT | To ensure proper social distancing and sanitizing of pews, parishioners will be asked to adhere to a seating chart for each Mass. Pews will be marked with alternating color coded letters. Please sit in these colored/lettered pews for the following Mass times. Attendants will also be present to assist parishioners.

WEEKDAY MASSES:

6:30 AM - Orange/A pews only

8:30 AM - Yellow/B pews only

SATURDAY MASSES:

8:30 AM - Orange/A pews only

4:30 PM - Yellow/B pews only

SUNDAY MASSES:

8 AM - Orange/A pews only

10 AM - Yellow/B pews only

12:30 PM - Green/C pews

OUTDOOR MASSES:

Please sit on or near the ten yard lines in order to provide adequate social distancing. Orange cones will be placed along each ten yard line to mark the amount of space to the front and back of attendees. Those who attend the outdoor Mass are encouraged to bring lawn chairs or a blanket. No seating will be provided. You may also consider bringing a hand-held umbrella for shade.

OFFERTORY | There will not be a collection during Mass. Upon the conclusion of Mass, please place your offertory in the collection baskets located in front of the altar, in the gathering space or at any exit of the football field. Alternatively, donations can be made online through FaithDirect.net, or mailed to/dropped off at the rectory (1055 N. Silvery Lane, Dearborn, MI 48128).

COMMUNION | A limited number of Eucharistic ministers will be on hand for each Mass to distribute communion to multiple pew banks/yard lines. Thank you in advance for your patience as we expect communion to take longer than usual. Communion procedures will be explained just before the reception of the Holy Eucharist. If you wish to receive the Eucharist, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Attendees should maintain 6 feet of distance from other attendees while proceeding to the front of church/field.
- All attendees should remove masks and gloves as they approach the minister. No gloves may be worn when receiving the Eucharist in hand.
- Attendees should bow and reply "Amen" at a distance of 6 feet from the Eucharistic minister and then approach to receive the Eucharist.

For your safety, if a Eucharistic minister accidentally touches the hand or mouth of a parishioner, he or she will sanitize his or her hands instantly with rubbing alcohol at a sanitizing station located near each Eucharistic minister's station.

**If you are uncomfortable receiving the Eucharist at this time, please know that there is no obligation to receive the Eucharist whenever you come to Mass.*

CONFESSIONS AVAILABLE

Private confessions will continue to be held from 2-4 PM on Saturdays under the three church awnings (located in front of the adoration chapel and on either side of the gathering space). Faithful are asked to line up in front of the main church entrance (adjacent with Silvery Lane), while waiting for one of the priests' stations to open up.

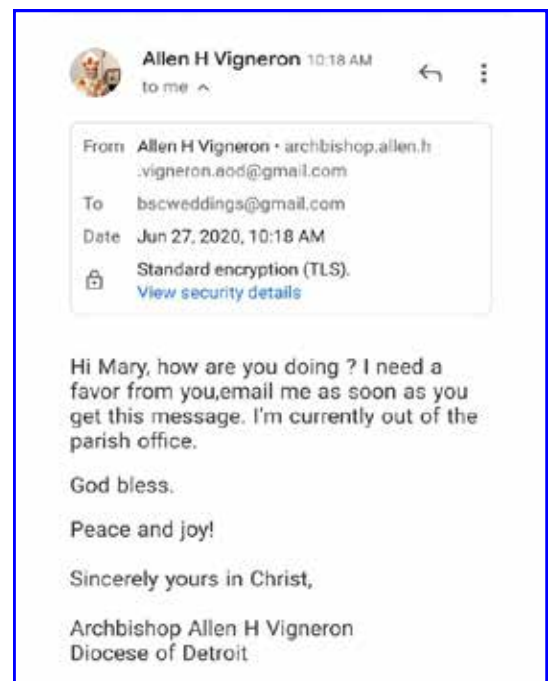

Meet Our Extended Family:

St. Benedict, Abbot (Feast Day July 11) 480 – 547

St. Benedict and his twin sister, St. Scholastica, were born around 480, into a distinguished family in central Italy. Benedict studied in Rome and, early in life, was drawn to live like a monk. At first, he became a hermit, but he soon realized that he could not live a hidden life in a small town any better than in a large city, so he withdrew to a cave high in the mountains for three years. Some monks chose Benedict as their leader for a while but found his strictness not to their taste. He had an idea of gathering various families of monks into one "Grand Monastery" to give them the benefit of unity, fraternity, and permanent worship in one house. Finally, he began to build what was to become one of the most famous monasteries in the world—Monte Cassino, commanding three narrow valleys running toward the mountains north of Naples. The Rule that gradually developed prescribed a life of liturgical prayer, study, manual labor, and living together in community under a common leader. In the course of the Middle Ages, all monasticism in the West was gradually brought under the Rule of St. Benedict.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Eggs Benedict Casserole for St. Benedict

Eggs Benedict Casserole for St. Benedict
½ pound Canadian Bacon or ham diced
6 English Muffins cut into 1-inch pieces
6 eggs
2 cups half and half
1 teaspoon Montreal Steak Seasoning

Hollandaise Sauce

4 egg yolks
½ cup heavy cream
2 tablespoons lime juice
1 teaspoon dried mustard
½ cup butter, melted
3 tablespoons chopped chives for garnish



Coat a 9x13 pan with cooking spray. Combine the ham and English Muffins in the pan. In a large bowl, whisk eggs, half and half, and steak seasonings. Pour over the top of the ham and muffins. Cover and allow to refrigerate overnight. In the morning preheat your oven to 375 F. Remove the pan from the fridge and allow it to come to room temperature for about 30 minutes. Wrap in aluminum foil for the first ½ hour of baking. Remove the foil and allow to bake for an additional 15 minutes or until puffed and brown. While it is baking, make the Hollandaise Sauce.

For the Hollandaise Sauce

In a blender or food processor, add the egg yolks, cream, and mustard. Cover and blend for 10 seconds or so. Slowly pour the hot melted butter into the mixture. Continue blending until the mixture has thickened, another minute or so. Pour hollandaise sauce over casserole and garnish with chopped chives. Serve hot.

There is no medal that possesses such power and none so highly esteemed by the Holy Church as the Medal of St. Benedict. Whosoever wears this medal with devotion, trusting to the holy Cross and the merits of the Holy Father, may expect powerful protection in his spiritual and temporal needs.

**EVJS IN OBITV NRO PRA
SENTIA MVNIAMUR:**
Latin for: "May his presence protect us in the hour of death."

FRONT OF MEDAL:
St. Benedict holding a cross in one hand and the book of his Rule in the other.

Feast Day July 11

**CHALICE WITH
SERPENT:** This image represents the event when a group of monks plotted to murder St. Benedict because they believed his doctrines to be too strict. They poisoned the mass wine, but when St. Benedict made the sign of the cross over the chalice, it fell to the ground and shattered.

CRUX PATRIS BENEDICTI:
Latin for: "The Cross of the Holy Father Benedict."

BACK OF MEDAL:
In the center on the back of the medal, there is a cross which St. Benedict greatly loved and used to drive away demons. On the vertical beam are the following letters: C.S.S.M.L. (Crux sacra sit mihi lux), which is Latin for, "May the holy cross be for me a light." On the horizontal beam, there are five letters N.D.S.M.D. (Non draco sit mihi dux), which is Latin for, "Let not the dragon be my guide."

**EX S M CASINO
MDCCCLXXX:**
Latin for: "From the Holy Mount of Cassino, 1880."

PAX
Latin for: "Peace."

**RIGHT SIDE OF
MEDAL:**
Encircling the right side of the back of the medal are the letters V.R.S.N.S.M.V. (Vade retro Satana; nunquam suade mihi vana), which is Latin for, "Be gone, Satan! Suggest not to me thy vain things."

RAVEN WITH BREAD IN BEAK:
This image represents a second attempt to murder St. Benedict by poisoning his bread, but God sent a raven who carried it off before he could consume it.

HISTORY OF SAINT BENEDICT MEDAL:
The exact time and date of the making of the St. Benedict Medal is not known, but it was formally approved by Pope Benedict XIV in the year 1741. The most common medal today is the Jubilee medal that was struck in the year 1880 in remembrance of the 1400th anniversary of St. Benedict's birth. The letters on the back of the medal has been a mystery until an ancient manuscript was discovered at Metten Abbey in Bavaria in the year 1647, in which an exorcism formula was found that matched the medal's inscriptions. The St. Benedict Medal is one of the oldest and most honored medals used to ward off evil spirits.

FOUR LARGE LETTERS AROUND CROSS:
C.S.P.B. (crux sancti Patris Benedicti) which is Latin for, "The cross of the Holy Father Benedict."

LEFT SIDE OF MEDAL:
Encircling the left side of the back of the medal are the letters S.M.Q.L.I.V.B. (Sunt mala quae libas; ipse venena bibas), which is Latin for, "The drink you offer is evil; drink that poison yourself."

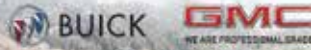
