The GPS plan accounts for three phases of COVID-19

Phase 1 Low Status

Return to school with social distancing as feasible as possible and other enhanced protocols for cleaning, personal protective equipment (masks...), cohort grouping, and thoughtful arrival and dismissal to mitigate high contact zones.

Phase 2 Moderate Status

Return to school with a hybrid schedule aimed to reduce the number of students in contact on any particular day by approximately 50%

Phase 3 COVID Critical Status

Full Remote Learning with students and teachers at home

Alternative Available to Families


An option will be available for a remote learning program for those students and parents who choose not to participate in face-to-face instruction for Phase 1 or Phase 2 based on individual considerations, most notably, mental and/or physical health challenges (CSDE AAA, June 29, 2020, p. 6).
