HOW OLD ARE WE? - My mom, who lived to be 102, loved to collect clever sayings, jokes, and words of wisdom. After she died, I found a notebook she'd filled with such things, and the following is one of her favorites – "Profile of a Senior." She really loved to talk about how life was "back in the day," was proud of the way she was able to manage through difficult times, and often referred to herself as "a tough old bird." Keep in mind that she was born in 1908, long before we came into this world, and the things mentioned below were probably already part of the growing-up years of many of you. However, given all of the heaviness on our hearts because of COVID-19, I thought I'd pass it on to you for a little stroll down Memory Lane, perhaps even a smile or two. Here we go....

We were before Batman, Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer and Snoopy. Before DDT, vitamin pills, disposable diapers, Q.E. One, Jeeps, Cheerios, instant coffee, decaffeinated anything, and McDonald's was unheard of. We thought fast food was what you ate during Lent. We were before Boy George, J.D. Salinger and Chiquita Banana, before FM radios, tape recorders electric typewriters, word processors, Muzak, disco dancing and that's not all bad!

In our day, cigarette smoking was fashionable, grass was for mowing, Coke was a refreshing drink and pot was something you could cook in. If we'd been around to explain CIA, MS, NATO, UFO, NFL, JFK, and ERA, we'd have said "alphabet soup." DIDN'T RECEIVE A CENSUS FORM? – Many of us haven't received the mailing from the Census Bureau regarding the 2020 Census. Whether or not you've received it, your participation is required and you can still complete the Census Questionnaire online by the end of this month. Here's what to do:

Go to the 2020 Census website: <u>https://my2020census.gov</u>. The opening page has links to Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ), instructions and choice of language.

To get started, click on the righthand side of the page at Start Here> or on the text box: Start Questionnaire.

The Questionnaire page asks you to Log In. If you've received the Census mailing, enter the 12-digit Census ID code from the mailing and proceed. If you have not received the mailing, go to the lower-left corner of the page and click "If you do not have a Census ID, click here" and proceed to provide the requested information.

Confirm that all the information you've provided is correct and click "Submit."

The results of the census will determine congressional representation and provide data that will impact communities for the next decade. They will inform decisions about allowing hundreds of billions of dollars to go to fire departments, school lunch programs, and other critical programs and services.

While Census Takers are scheduled to visit homes of nonresponders beginning May 1, the Census Bureau will continue to monitor the evolving COVID-19 outbreak and will adjust operations as necessary in order to follow federal, state and local guidelines.


Census Takers must show a photo ID with the U.S. Department of Commerce seal and an expiration date. If you ask, they will provide a supervisor's contact information and/or the census regional office phone number for verification if you have any suspicions of a scam. They will never ask you for your full Social Security number, bank account or credit card numbers, money or donations or anything on behalf of a political party. This Census does not ask citizenship status.
