A MOTHERS DAY REFLECTION – I found this beautiful piece of writing by Rovi Zacharias and wanted to share it with you today. "Happy Mother's Day to all the mothers on this occasion set aside to celebrate your role and influence in the family. My mother taught me more with her proverbs and one-liners than I ever learned with long arguments, and I'm ever grateful for her imprint on my life.

As I reflect on this occasion, I think about the beautiful relationship Jesus had with his mother. I find it fascinating that when he was in his final moments of this earthly journey providing redemption for the whole world, he paused to make sure that someone would take care of his mother. Even in the depths of his own pain and agony, Jesus was keenly aware of Mary's distress and did not want her to feel abandoned at that moment, transferring the responsibility of his mother's wellbeing to his beloved disciple, John.

I thank God for the value he places on motherhood, and I pray we will honor the mothers in our lives today and every day. For all you mothers, I pray you to feel celebrated in a special way and treasured by your Heavenly Father, knowing that your sacrificial love and tireless efforts will be rewarded." Happy Mother's Day!

HAVING THAT CONVERSATION – The ages of the readers of this column vary across a pretty broad spectrum. There are those who are what we consider to be true seniors, and then there are those who are the children of these seniors. I've heard that some of you forward the column to parents who are members of other local parishes or live out of state. Today's topic addresses talking to elderly parents about their money, a sensitive issue. 71% of adults haven't had this conversation.

Perhaps you've noticed some things about them that are "off." Your mother, who was fastidious about keeping her home clean, now doesn't notice the clutter. Your father was manic about paying bills on time, but now payment notices are stacked on the table, unopened. Then there are the frequent memory lapses and uncharacteristic behaviors that put your brain into a disturbing loop. This is when you need to be asking yourself if it's time for "The Talk." Don't wait until it's too late.

Many of you have heard about people who've had to get involved with their parents' finances as a result of a health or financial emergency. It's a lot harder to be proactive because emotions and the stress of a crisis situation can get in the way of a rational response. And it can be a whole lot more expensive.

One of the keys to a successful talk with your parents is knowing what not to ask. Remember how frustrated you felt when you were a teenager and thought you knew everything and your parents were constantly reminding you that you didn't? That's how they're going to feel if you start acting like the parent and treating them like naïve kids. And there's the possibility that your parents will rebuff your efforts to discuss their finances.

According to Michelle Singletary, who writes "The Color Money" column in the Washington Post, an excellent guide was published last year that will help you through the process of having fruitful financial conversations that lead to meaningful action. It's "Mom and Dad. We Need to Talk: How to Have Essential Conversations with Your Parents About Their Finances" by Cameron Huddleston, a personal finance writer. This is only one among many resources that you'll find on the Internet on the subject. (Adapted from an article by Michelle Singletary.)

Parents, as well, should consider bringing up the subject of finances with their adult children, even if only to let them know they have all of their legal documents in order, their location, and that of their banking and investment accounts as well as insurance policies. That conversation could morph into a helpful, more detailed picture of their financial situation, one they would feel much more comfortable sharing because they were the ones who opened the door to it.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) announced the establishment of the Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting Service www.arlingtondiocese.org/child-protection/catholic-bishop-abuse-reporting-service. This allows people to report an incident of sexual abuse and related misconduct by a bishop. The Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting Service will receive and relay those reports to the proper Church authorities for investigation. Where a report includes a crime, such as the sexual abuse of a minor, it will also be reported to civil authorities. Otherwise, reports will be kept confidential.
