love for us.




Live Jesus - March 21, 2020







AGING IN PLACE – A great deal of interest was shown in the series "The Road Ahead," which appeared here in May/ June of last year. It chronicled my experiences in making the decision to sell my house and move into an active retirement community. Today a new series begins, this time exploring another option, which is to age in place. The series is an adaptation of the cover story of the February issue of Kiplinger's Retirement Report. It will explore the moves you need to make now to make aging in place successful. I hope it will be helpful for those of you who want to remain in your own homes rather than transition into senior housing.

If you're a longtime homeowner and thinking ahead to your next stage in life, you might be familiar with the term "aging in place." Perhaps you're already considering renovation projects, such as grab bars in the bathroom, or widening your doorways, to help you stay put. You're not alone. About 76% of us who are 50+ years of age say we want to stay in our homes. According to AARP research, 77% hope to remain in their neighborhoods as long as possible.

But renovations are only a small part of what you need to make aging in place work for you. Typically, it's less expensive to remain in your home than to pay for assisted living. But that doesn't mean it's a slam dunk to stay put. You'll still have a long to-do list. For example, you'll need to plan ahead for how you'll manage maintenance and care — for your home, and for yourself - as you age and face health challenges.

And be aware that strengthening your social fabric now might be just as important as shoring up your finances and installing a curbless shower. Experts say building a network of support among friends and neighbors, and establishing strong ties in your community are important roles in keeping older adults healthy and functioning. You won't age in place well if you're isolated and alone, a reality you don't want to overlook as you consider your housing and financial options.

Jessica Finlay, a Michigan researcher who studies older adults and their neighborhoods, says "The social connections you have and the access to services in your community are often more important than anything else. You need a reason to get out of bed in the morning and to get out the front door." Aging in place also can be more challenging than you might expect. Studies show that while most seniors say they want to age in place, a much smaller percentage of them actually manage to accomplish it. Transportation is often a problem when you can no longer drive, you can't get to medical appointments or to other outings. Long-term-care costs, even when you stay at home, outpace savings. Older homes can be costly to maintain and downsizing to a smaller one closer to a city center may be more expensive than you thought.

The worst-case scenario is finding yourself "stuck in place," as Freddie Mac chief economist Sam Khater puts it. You're still in your home but you aren't able to age well because you can't afford to make needed improvements and you're increasingly isolated. But the good news is that you can start now to make aging in place successful, even if you're still a few years away from a final decision. Even getting the idea on your radar allows you time to save up for individual renovation projects and to make an overall plan. It's not easy to think about how you're going to age and what life will be like when our mobility is limited, but forcing yourself to begin preparing now will pay off later.

The definition of aging in place is flexible and still evolving, as more older Americans find new kinds of arrangements to stay in their homes. It often means one-floor living. Or it might mean sharing your home if the rent will help you afford to keep it. Or you might sell your longtime home and move into a smaller one, closer to amenities, where you plan to grow old.

Regardless of which arrangements fit you, there are five moves now to start doing now to help you age in place successfully. If there's truly no place like home for you, there are ways to make it work. Next week you'll read about Move #1, "Start Early." Stay tuned! (Thanks to Kiplinger Retirement Letter.)
