

Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues Tuesdays Feb 25th - April 7th During the Season of Lent, our Tuesday Scripture Study will be exploring Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues. Join Bishop Robert Barron for this presentation of the seven deadly sins, those great spiritual blocks that inhibit our flourishing in relationship with God and one another. Based on Dante's writings, the seven deadly sins correspond to the seven stories of Dante's Mt. Purgatory. Pride, envy, anger, sloth, gluttony, avarice and lust are all presented as patterns of dysfunction within us that lead to unhappiness. Bishop Barron shows us how to counteract these seven sinful patterns through a conscious process of opposition, known as the "seven lively virtues." These offer antidotes to each sin and help set us on the right path to healing and happiness. 

ENCORE MOMENTS – Disposing of American Flags presents a dilemma for some people, they just don't know what to do with them once they get old, tattered and torn. If you have an American flag like this, you can properly dispose of it at a few county government locations. One drop-off place is at the Fairfax County Government Center, 12000 Government Center Parkway in Fairfax. When you walk into the lobby of the Center, you'll see a flag disposal box located near the main information desk. There are flag disposal boxes located at the I-66 Transfer Station and are available during residential hours. The American Legion collects flags and conducts a Flag Retirement Ceremony at both of these sites. Another place is at any Fairfax County Police Station where they're collected twice a year by a Police Honor Guard for proper disposal. The most convenient place to dispose of it is at Mill and Cherry

Streets, near the Vienna Community Center where you can drop it into a specially-painted mailbox.

LOOKING AHEAD – If you're tired of looking up at gray skies, then consider attending an afternoon of music that's sure to lift your spirits.
