The Season of Lent:

Brochures with the full schedule of opportunities this Lent to enter more fully into our renewal, both as individuals and as a Community, have been emailed to every parish family. Additional brochures, in both Spanish and English, along with other Lenten materials, will available in the bookracks as you enter the church.

Norms for Fast and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday, February 26th and Good Friday, April 10th are days of fasting and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed. Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older.



On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, Church law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the Parish Priest should be consulted.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and Catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Initiation into the Church or the renewal of Baptismal Promises at Easter.



Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues Tuesdays Feb 25th - April 7th During the Season of Lent, our Tuesday Scripture Study will be exploring Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues. Join Bishop Robert Barron for this presentation of the seven deadly sins, those great spiritual blocks that inhibit our flourishing in relationship with God and one another. Based on Dante's writings, the seven deadly sins correspond to the seven stories of Dante's Mt. Purgatory. Pride, envy, anger, sloth, gluttony, avarice and lust are all presented as patterns of dysfunction within us that lead to unhappiness. Bishop Barron shows us how to counteract these seven sinful patterns through a conscious process of opposition, known as the "seven lively virtues." These offer antidotes to each sin and help set us on the right path to healing and happiness.







Miércoles de Ceniza - 26 de febrero - Horario de misas 6:30am, 8:30am, 12:10pm y 7:00pm bilingual. La bendición y distribución de las cenizas tendrá lugar sólo en las Misas.

Durante la Temporada de Cuaresma: Obtenga un folleto de Cuaresma en los estantes de la entrada de la iglesia. La Cuaresma es mucho más que ayuno y oración, es un tiempo de cambio, de reflexión y apertura del corazón. El ayuno es un medio de disciplina, castidad, y el refrenar los apetitos. (Mateo 4:4) "Él respondió y dijo: "Escrito está: No solo de pan vivirá el hombre, sino de toda palabra que sale de la boca de Dios".

Normas para el ayuno y la abstinencia: El Miércoles de Ceniza, 26 de febrero, y el Viernes Santo, 10 de abril, son días obligatorios de abstinencia y de ayuno. También deben abstenerse los viernes durante la Cuaresma. Todas las personas a partir de los 18 años de edad y los que no hayan cumplido los 59 años de edad, deben ayunar. Se permite comer una vez durante el día de ayuno, aunque también pueden comer dos veces para mantener la energía, según la necesidad de cada individuo. Sin embargo, estas dos comidas no deben igualar a la cantidad de una comida completa. No se puede comer entre comidas, pero está permitido tomar líquido, incluyendo leche y jugos. La abstinencia se debe cumplir desde los 14 años de edad en adelante. En los días de abstinencia, no se debe comer carne, aunque si la salud o la habilidad para cumplir su trabajo se ve seriamente afectado, la ley no lo obliga. Si tiene alguna duda sobre la práctica del ayuno o de la abstinencia, consulte al Sacerdote de su parroquia. El ayuno, la limosna y la oración, son las tres disciplinas tradicionales durante la Cuaresma. Los feligreses y los catecúmenos deben realizar estas prácticas con seriedad en espíritu de penitencia y en preparación para la Iniciación a la Iglesia o para la renovación de las promesas Bautismales durante la Semana Santa.

Seite Razones Para Ayunar:

- 1. Desde el principio, Dios pidió algún ayuno y el pecado entró en el mundo porque Adán y Eva rompieron el ayuno.
- 2. Para el cristiano, el ayuno es finalmente una cuestión de ayunar del pecado.
- 3. El ayuno revela nuestra dependencia de Dios y no los recursos de este mundo.
- 4. El ayuno es un modo antiguo de prepararse para la Eucaristía el alimento verdadero.
- 5. El ayuno es preparación para el Bautismo (y todos los sacramentos), para la recepción de la gracia.
- 6. El ayuno es un medio de conservar recursos para dárselos a los pobres.
- 7. El ayuno es un medio de disciplina, castidad, y el refrenar los apetitos.


