Equipment

Pencil Cases

- A blue handwriting pen
- Three sharp pencils.

PE Kits

- A plain or school yellow T shirt, black shorts, black leggings and a change of trainers for outdoor games.

- A dark waterproof sports jacket is advisable for KS2 children, who are expected to participate in outdoor PE in all weathers.

Homework

- Homework in Year 5 is very similar to previous years.
- Each night you will have your spellings to complete as well as reading and ensuring your reading record is signed by an adult.
- On a Monday and Wednesday you will have an English task to complete, sometimes you will be given a big task on a Monday that will be due on the Thursday.
- On a Tuesday you will receive a maths worksheet to complete. On a Thursday you will need to log in and complete tasks on Times Table Rock Stars or DB Primary.
- All of these tasks will be monitored by various teachers and failure to complete will result in a break time detention.

Breakfast club, Fun Zone and after school clubs

Breakfast Club

- Breakfast club doors are open between 8.00am and 8.25am. The child enters through the double white doors at the end of the Year 1 classrooms.
- Breakfast club is open to all and can be paid for, in advance, online.

Fun Zone

Fun Zone is an after school supervised club that runs from 3.15pm until 5.45pm. Spaces are limited so places need to be applied for via the school office.

After-school clubs

- We offer a variety of after-school activities which can be sport-based, crafts and many others. A letter is sent out prior to each half term to allow you to apply for these.
- Spaces are limited so giving every child one club per half term is the first priority.

The school day

- Every day 5A and 5S door will open at 8:35am and will close at 8:50am.
- On a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday we swap for maths at 8:50am and maths finishes at 9:50am. We will then swap for spelling, where we learn a new rule and mark our spellings from the previous night. Our break time on these days is 10:05 - 10:20 where you can either go out onto the playground or go to the canteen and purchase toast.
- After break you will have a class lesson such as science, topic, P.E or art. This will continue till 11:20. From 11:20 12:20 we have English writing or English reading dependant on the day. From 12:20 12:45 you will return to your maths groups and complete maths fluency activities; practising skills from previous lessons.
- Our lunch time is from 12:45 1:30pm. During this time you are able to play on playground, visit lunch club or 5S is open every day with a different member of staff supervising.
- From 1:30 3:00 you will spend time in your home class where you will be taught various foundation subjects such as: topic, science, French.
- On a Thursday in year 5, you will experience a slightly different day. In the morning you will have lessons such as P.E, music and computing. These will all happen with your home class. In the afternoon you will have a maths mastery session and an SPAG lesson.
- Teaching ends at 3:00pm, we then get ready to go home and leave at approximately 3:10pm.

Trips

This year we hope to attend the Winchester Science Museum and Salt Hill Park activity Centre.

Winchester Science Museum:

During this trip children will have the chance to consolidate their knowledge of 'Planets and Forces'. There are various apparatus and activities where children will have the opportunity to investigate various theories and phenomena. During this trip we also attended the planetarium, where children watch a show about all the planets and star constellations. After this, they attend an interactive workshop led by one of the members of staff from the museum.

Salt Hill Park Activity Centre:

This is a reward trip offered to children at the end of the year. During this trip children will have the opportunity to participate in various activities throughout the day. It is a thoroughly enjoyable trip, loved by all children and all adults!

FAQs

- How was my child levelled at the end of last year?
 - Last academic year we gave the children a predicted grade based on their performance up to March 2020. This is to allow their new teachers an awareness of their ability and plan accordingly.
- What is going to happen to Year 2 and Year 6 SATS?
 - Currently the department for education has not given out guidance how what assessment will take place at the end of the academic year in July 2021. As soon as we have been informed we will communicate this with parents.

- Will there be parent interviews this year?
 - We have scheduled in these and will ensure appropriate safety measures are in place prior to these taking place. If there is any change to these plans, we will communicate this to the parents as soon as we are able.
