Equipment

PE Kits

- A plain or school yellow T shirt, black shorts, black leggings and a change of trainers for outdoor games.
- Black or grey tracksuit for outdoor games.
- A dark waterproof sports jacket is advisable for KS2 children, who are expected to participate in outdoor PE in all weathers.
- Swimming kit (yr3) plain black or grey swimsuit / trunks, swimming hat and goggles.

Homework

During your time in Nursery you will have the opportunity to look after Phil Bear. He is a very special Bear that likes to ask lots of questions. He will stay with you for the weekend and you will be able to answer his question and draw a lovely picture in his book to bring back to school on Monday to share with your friends. We ask that you share your thoughts with your grown ups but you do you drawing yourself.

We are very proud to be an *Active movement* school. We are teaching the children to stay healthy and active through continuous movement and eating a healthy balanced diet. At school we have some active movement 'puppies' that like to go on adventures at the weekend with the children. Each child will have the opportunity to take a 'puppy' home for the weekend and draw a picture of how they stayed healthy with they puppy. We encourage the children to do all their homework themselves.

Breakfast club, Fun Zone and after school clubs

Breakfast Club

- Breakfast club doors are open between 8.00am and 8.25am. The child enters through the double white doors at the end of the Year 1 classrooms.
- Breakfast club is open to all and can be paid for, in advance, online.

Fun Zone

Fun Zone is an after school supervised club that runs from 3.15pm until 5.45pm. Spaces are limited so places need to be applied for via the school office.

After-school clubs

- We offer a variety of after-school activities which can be sport-based, crafts and many others. A letter is sent out prior to each half term to allow you to apply for these.
- Spaces are limited so giving every child one club per half term is the first priority.

The school day

A Typical Day:

- > A typical Nursery session follows this pattern:
- 8.30 am Children arrive and are greeted by the Nursery staff. The children have a short group time with their key worker. For 10 20 minutes the children enjoy learning about foundation subjects.
- 8.50 10.40 Children take part in free play inside the Nursery and outside in the garden which is structured to cover the Foundation curriculum. Children have free movement between the two environments and are supported in their learning by the staff. During this time, the children have access to a snack table where they are able to select milk or water and fruit.
- 11.00 -11.15 Children return to their groups with their key worker for another short, structured carpet session. This may include a story, music time or a circle time.
- > 11.15 The doors are opened by staff and parents come to their children's group to collect them.
- > 11.30 Doors are closed so children must be picked up promptly.
- This is repeated in the afternoon session which runs from 12.30pm 3.15 pm (doors will close promptly at 3.30pm).
- When collecting your child, please ensure you are ready to greet them with a large smile and a keen interest in knowing what they have been doing over the 3 hour session and keep your mobile phones stored safely in your bag or pocket. That phone call can wait - your child's news can't!

Trips

- We are fortunate to have a lovely farm that visit the Nursery children here at school. It provides an educational, safe and secure hands on experience for the children. It allows the children be inquisitive with their questions and for some children overcoming fears.
- We have a vegetable patch within the school grounds. It is always nice for the children to walk over and have a look at what is growing. This visit is linked to our planning.

FAQs

- How was my child levelled at the end of last year?
 - Last academic year we gave the children a predicted grade based on their performance up to March 2020. This is to allow their new teachers an awareness of their ability and plan accordingly.
- What is going to happen to Year 2 and Year 6 SATS?
 - Currently the department for education has not given out guidance how what assessment will take place at the end of the academic year in July 2021. As soon as we have been informed we will communicate this with parents.

- Will there be parent interviews this year?
 - We have scheduled in these and will ensure appropriate safety measures are in place prior to these taking place. If there is any change to these plans, we will communicate this to the parents as soon as we are able.

FAQs continued...

- Do I need to bring a snack for my child?
 - No. We provide milk and fruit for every child in Nursery.
- My child isn't potty trained what shall I do?
 - While we will do everything we can to support you child through their toileting needs. We advise you to use the time at home to start the process. You child will feel more comfortable with you at home.
- Can I provide resources for the Nursery?
 - While this is a lovely idea we ask if the parent could contribute £1 a week to a fund which provides many extra consumables that young children use at school. This includes cooking and arts activities. It also funds additional toys and equipment for the department.
