DATC Programs Disclosure Statement

The objective of our work and training programs is to provide opportunities for skill development, work experience and career preparation. Standards have been established which will enable each student to maximize their possibilities for success.

Students wishing to attend DATC are strongly encouraged to attend the DATC orientation, contact DATC for times and places.

The DATC offers courses in two blocks of three-hours each. Time blocks are from 8:00 A.M. to 11 A.M. and 12:00 P.M. to 3:00 P.M. Students may contact DATC to begin at an earlier time (7:30 am).

Some programs provide evening hours also contact DATC for times. Because the block times for the DATC do not align with the regular high school schedules, students will need to be aware of courses that may create conflicts with other high school offerings.

Knowledge of DATC enrollment requirements and course prerequisites will be necessary before enrolling in DATC courses.

To facilitate training opportunities at the DATC:

- Students should be on track with high school required classes before scheduling college level courses.
- Courses at the DATC are graded as follows:

Below 70%, the student is considered to not have completed the course.

Students attending Davis Applied Technology College **must** receive a **passing grade** from the college to receive High School credit.

Note: Students with disabilities may receive an adjusted grade based on accommodations.

Students enrolled in a DATC program agree to meet the following requirements:

- 1. Do quality work in the training program.
- 2. Maintain good attendance.
- 3. Maintain a passing grade.
- 4. Arrive at the class on time. Excessive tardiness or inappropriate behavior may result in a "u" or removal from DATC. DATC may remove a student from the college if the student has 10 or more consecutive absences.
- 5. Students need to provide their own transportation and parent or guardian must sign in the appropriate space below.

Neither the Davis School District nor Clearfield High School is responsible for student transportation to and from the DATC. The student's parent or guardian has sole responsibility for providing the student transportation to and from the DATC. A student may be approved to drive him/herself to DATC classes by the school CTE Coordinator upon receiving proof that the student or the student's parent/guardian carries all automobile insurance required by state law.
