OPTION 2 -ONLINE INSTRUCTION FACILITATED THROUGH SchoolsPLP

 Parents/Caregivers Choose Option 2 by July 27, 2020 for 1st Semester Monitor student progress on coursework. Developing a "school schedule" is recommended to keep routines in place for students while working from home. Communicate questions and concerns immediately to appropriate online teachers Monitor and support student progress through an online curriculum with parent/caregiver access to the online platform and progress information. Participate in online instruction designed and delivered by SchoolsPLP, an outside company specializing in design and delivery of virtual learning Will not come to a school building for instruction and will not be in the same classes or have the same teachers as students participating in Option 1 Should follow a schedule to complete online learning, assignments and assessments Will have access to courses in all core areas (English language arts, mathematics, sciences and social studies) Will also have limited access to special area courses (K-6) and elective courses (7-12) Communicate questions and concerns immediately to appropriate online teachers Will participate in virtual check-in meetings designed to support student course progress and provide opportunities for students to connect with each other Will earn grades for their work If state or local regulations require a school closure, students participating in Option 2 will continue as scheduled, using the online curriculum and platform. May be eligible to participate in after-school activities at their school building, including extra-curricular activities. Should contact the Oakwood Athletic Department for eligibility requirements 	 Technology Department Will provide a device for each student to use at home. Students will not be asked to share devices. Additional Information

- Students and families will be permitted to request a change of enrollment back to face-to-face instruction at the end of the semester.
- Families interested in returning to face-to-face instruction at the end of the semester must communicate their request, in writing, to their child's respective building principal, no later than 14 days prior to the end of the first semester Dec. 4, 2020.
- Students must commit to being active online and working on coursework during normal school hours.
- Students will be required to meet with all of their teachers, every day, online in some capacity. This interaction could be through a quick class meeting, a small group conversation, one-on-one support or other ways to connect. The schedule will vary by building and grade level.
- Students not logged into school on time will be considered tardy. Students who do not log into school at all during the school day will be considered absent.
- Students with disabilities will receive specially designed instruction as outlined in their IEP.

After-School Activities

- Students will be permitted to participate in after school activities, where possible.
- School-sponsored sports will be fully open to students participating in Online Instruction, provided they meet all eligibility requirements. Please contact the Oakwood Athletic office to confirm eligibility.
- The online curriculum through SchoolsPLP is NCAA approved.

Technology

- All technology use is subject to the district's Acceptable Use Policy (AUP).
- Students will be required to take care of their school-issued device while it is in their care, ensuring it remains in the same condition it was given to them at the end of the school year.
- Students may be required to turn back in their device for inspection and collection at the end of the school year.

Curriculum

- Our plan is to use the Ohio standards as represented in the SchoolsPLP platform and curriculum for grades K-12. More info can be found at <u>https://schoolsplp.com/</u>.
- The goal is to match up current student schedules with the equivalent courses on the Oakwood approved SchoolsPLP platform. In cases where this is not possible, Oakwood Schools counselors will reach out to families to share other options available.

HB 164 Requirements

HB 164 requires all schools with a remote learning plan to ensure certain measures are taken. These are the six requirements:

• Determining & documenting instructional needs

- Determining competency, granting credit and promoting students to a higher grade level
- Attendance requirements and documentation of participation in learning opportunities
- How student progress will be monitored
- Description of how equitable access to quality instruction will be ensured
- Description of professional development activities offered to teachers
