Firstly, a warm welcome to new and returning families. We are delighted that our students have again achieved a strong set of results from the DP and MYP examinations taken in May.

We congratulate the Class of 2019 and our Grade 10 (now Grade 11). Again for DP, we were well above the world average and to achieve this with over 90% of the cohort taking on the challenge of the full DP and 97% successfully achieving the IB Diploma is fantastic. Of course, the numbers only tell part of the story and we are particularly proud of the students whom it was borderline whether they would achieve the full DP or not, and with effort and support they were indeed successful.

We wish the class of 2019 every success as they begin a wide variety of courses in universities such as Stanford, Penn State, Columbia, Warwick, Exeter, St Andrews, McGill and Erasmus.

It was the first time students from ABA have completed the MYP onscreen examinations, the fact that all subject averages in these onscreen examinations were above world average is a real testament to the efforts of students and their teachers.

Start to the academic year

It has been a great start to the academic year, one full of energy, spirit and learning. During my daily classroom visits I have been impressed with the engagement of students and as always, the relationships between classes and their teachers.

Our Grade 11 students were introduced to the IB Diploma this week, and from my own perspective I was impressed with my Theory of Knowledge class and their curiosities. With a high number of new students to ABA in Grade 11, the orientation was important to support the Class of 2021 make a good start to the year.

Thank you to parents for reinforcing and students for following the dress code, there is a marked improvement from last academic year. Please keep this up. In addition, I thank students for following instructions to ensure the cafeteria and morning registration are device free zones.

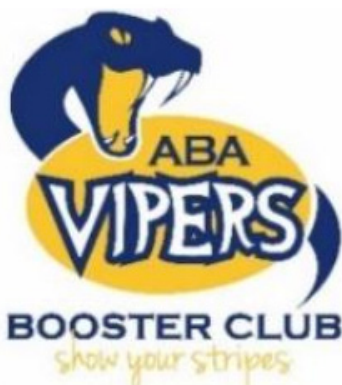
