Student/Parent Health Information

As many of us are aware, the use of e-cigarettes (often referred to as "vaping") has been on the rise among teenagers globally. At ABA, we are taking steps to ensure that students and parents have an understanding and awareness of the hazards and potential health risks involved with vaping and also know how to access resources for support.

In June, we had a parent information session about Teen Safety (vaping, risk taking behaviors and online safety) lead by Mr. Wadsworth, Ms. Anthony and Mrs. Alli. There will be a repeat session offered to parents in October - please look forward to more information regarding the date and time in the coming Newsletters.

Throughout the year in Learning Mentor sessions and Niqash, students grade 6-12 are discussing a variety of teen health issues, including the dangers of using e-cigarettes. 

Approaching the 'Core' elements of the IB Diploma

Developing and maintaining core strength is a vital component of keeping fit but also an apt analogy for success on the IB Diploma programme.

The 'Core' component of the Diploma programme is the combination of the Extended Essay, the Theory of Knowledge (ToK) course and Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS). It is what makes the Diploma programme unique, and is excellent preparation for the world beyond school. When the Diploma team came to visit ABA as part of our joint CIS/IB/MSA accreditation visit, they were very impressed with our implementation of the Diploma at ABA, resulting in many commendations.

With reference to the Core component, one of our visitors told me: 'Get the Core right and you get the Diploma right.' I knew ABA had a great CAS programme and were performing above world averages in both ToK and EE, so I wasn't 100% sure whether his words were acknowledgement or instruction! Of course, continual improvement is a watchword in education, but that phrase



stuck with me, and we have been working hard on our 'core strength' ever since. It dawned on me that the advice is important for coordinators and teaching teams, but so much more important for Diploma students, and much more difficult to get across. For many students, the Core is seen as 'additional' work they have to do. The combination of ToK and Extended Essay is only awarded a maximum of 3 points out of the total of 45, so it is not surprising that it can be seen as secondary to the important work of gaining the highest marks out of 7 in their subjects and especially in HL subjects, when university places might depend on it.

CAS is a pass/fail, but again can slip down the list of priorities when academic demands on time grow. But the right approach to the Core will drive achievement across the board, in turn reaping rewards far beyond the three so-called 'bonus' points. We have been working to educate our students, teachers, Learning Mentors and parents about how students can drive learning on the Diploma through the Core, and how to integrate the Core elements more closely which will mean less work, more ownership and more efficient working practices.

To that end, last Spring, Mr. Shaymardanov and I gave a presentation on 'ToK and Intergrating the Core' to parents of this year's Grade 11.

We would like to extend this opportunity once again to parents of Grade 11 students who may be new to ABA, or missed the presentation last year, on Tuesday October 8th, in the PAC from 5.30pm. During this session parents will come to understand the Core and notably ToK a little better and will gain the understanding to help their sons and daughters look at how they can make personal choices on the Diploma, take ownership of it and ease their workload at the same time! Integrated Core strength is really at the centre of a great Diploma: students with a full CAS portfolio typically have the highest Diploma scores. Students who use their ToK thinking in their Extended Essays always score very well; ToK presentations that explore the knowledge questions raised by an EE are genuine, high level personal journeys of inquiry. In short, - get the Core right, get the Diploma right.

This was followed by a general presentation about the university application process and what support is in place to guide students through the completion of each step.



Two members of our parent community, Mrs. Alison Al Maskari and Mrs. Reem Al Shaikh, generously shared their recent experience of the application and admissions journey, providing an easily relatable perspective for the parents in the audience. For our seniors, the application process has started in earnest! The strong partnership that exists between students, parents and the school is certainly the ideal condition that will help each student find his/her individual pathway to success.


