### Message from the University Counselor

#### **Promoting Career-Consciousness**

'So, what do you want to be when you grow up?' is perhaps a harder question for students these days than it was for previous generations as today's youngsters have such an extensive range of choices. The reverse is also true, however, as they now have more tools than ever before to help them find the answer!

One of the talking points in High School Advisory sessions this semester has been the value of beginning career exploration well before the senior year. For Grade 10 students who will very soon be opting for their IB Diploma subjects and for students in Grade 11 who are beginning their university search, having a specified field in mind certainly provides a clear sense of direction. Even some of our seniors might still be weighing their options. By now, most students are mindful of the thought process that should go into choosing a career as well as some key factors that are worth considering: the perfect combination of what you enjoy, what you're good at and what is in demand.



Students are also becoming increasingly aware that the route, even for attaining similar career goals, might look different for each individual: the path to success is indeed a very personal one. Being – at various stages - entirely undecided or changing preferences once, twice or a few times is also perfectly natural. Search portals such as Unifrog (the Careers Library) are now being more widely used to gather details about careers in terms of subject requirements, prerequisite skills, role expectations, likely routines as well as employment prospects. Staying abreast of job market trends will help students to ensure that they are not entering a field that will be obsolete by the time they complete the first semester of their undergraduate studies!

One resource that our students always find invaluable to their career exploration journey is the opportunity to consult directly with professionals so they can learn more about different fields. This is where we rely on the goodwill of our parent body and local community in volunteering their time and expertise as they provide information about various professions. The ABA Careers Fair is where this fantastic exchange takes place. This school year's event is scheduled for Monday 16th March, 2020 at 12:25 – 2:15pm.
