Parents were asked to complete the thinking routine: "I used to think... Now I think..." Here are just a few of their responses:

- I used to think that maths was boring and feel nervous about getting it right. Now I think maths is so very interesting. I could end up loving maths for the first time ever!
- I used to think that math is a fixed science. Now I think it is flexible and liveable.
