A Reminder: Our Professional Learning Days next week, Sunday and Monday 9th and 10th February 2020. There are no classes for students these days. Regular classes resume on Tuesday 11th February. Over these two days, we will have two of the world's leading experts on our campus: Mark Church and Kath Murdock.

Mark Church is a senior researcher at Project Zero, Harvard Graduate School of Education. He is the author of Intellectual Character from Jossey-Bass. Mark is the Learning, Assessment, and Instructional Resource Supervisor for the Traverse City Area Public Schools in Michigan.

Kath Murdock is an experienced teacher, author, university lecturer and popular consultant, originally from Melbourne. She supports the

development of inquiry programs and practices. Kath's style is r efreshingly practical, inclusive and always connected to the real world of teaching. She is widely respected for her work in the field of inquiry based learning and intergrative curriculum.

Over the two days, we will expose teachers to this first-hand research, make connections with our ELPs (see right) as well as explore what thinking/learning looks like in practice. We will reinforce the connection between how teachers learn and how those experiences impact their teaching and how their students learn. We will end the sessions with an action plan for the participants which can be reinforced/discussed/modeled during the Tuesday 11th February Faculty meetings. It is a very exciting proposition and one that very few teachers are exposed to.

The workshop added much value to our approach to teaching math conceptually, and deepened the participants' understanding of how best to support learners during maths learning. On Sunday, our Teaching Assistants ran a mini workshop for teachers. They shared common mistakes and misconceptions in math, games to enhance number sense which led the team into rich professional conversations and gave all the teachers multiple ideas to integrate into their class-rooms. We are proud of our Teaching Assistants' commitment to their own life-long learning and their willingness to share and implement their new understandings.

MYP Assessment

On Monday, February 2, parents who were new to MYP participated in a workshop on MYP Assessment. This workshop follows a previous session that focused on the philosophy of the MYP. The purpose was to help parents improve their understanding of MYP terminology and

assessment processes.

Parents enthusiastically engaged with the tasks that were set and used the opportunity to gain familiarity with the phrases that were common in the MYP. One task provided the parents with student work and the task description. Working in teams they used the rubrics that were provided and discussed how as teachers they would have decided on the child's level of performance. The other task guided parents through the process that led to a final MYP Achievement level.

The purpose of these sessions is to help parents support their child. By getting an in depth knowledge of the MYP, parents are in a very strong position to assist their children.

Our next session will delve into key terms such as ATL skills, Global Contexts and Concepts.


International Cultural Festival - A World without Borders
