Message from the Middle School

MYP 5 students will participate in eAssessment familiarization from 16th - 20th February. Familiarization provides an opportunity for students to experience the atmosphere of an MYP eAssessment. In this way, your child is not unprepared for the actual examinations beginning on 11th May .

The nomenclature "familiarisation" is deliberate and so should not be conflated with the idea of a mock exam. Familiarisation places students in the real context with an expectation that they will be able to transfer the processes that they experience now, to the actual examinations later.



Therefore, students are expected to be on time, have fully charged laptops, have working headphones, pencils and/or pens, and rest well for the day ahead. Additionally, the session will

familiarise students with the interface of the onscreen tests coupled with the time pressure that comes with an assessment of this nature.

Importantly, familiarisation is not only for students. For us, it allows us to test our systems, finetune our protocols, improve our communication framework and sensitize students and teachers with the expectations of an onscreen exam. While the examination practice is important, the conditions (being entirely new) will require the same level of planning and organisation.

Accordingly, your role as parent is critical to your child's first experience in this format. Remind your child to organise their device for the next day, keep abreast of the schedule, find out how the day went, and be present to calm when anxieties take over. Working on a computer in an examination scenario can be daunting, so the more you reduce the stress around this the better. Furthermore, our teachers will be using this as an opportunity to further develop learning rather than to decide final levels.

The onscreen examinations will be conducted in the GYM and have two start times based on a two session day. Session 1 will be from 7:30 am - 10: 30 am and Session 2 from 11:00 am - 2:00 pm. Ensure your child is punctual especially for Session 2 with advanced arrangements made for travel to school. Students who need to be in school can use the library or any available space as long as they are mindful of the fact that other classes are still in session.

This is an important time in your child's life so ensure that the things you can control are providing the best atmosphere for their success.


