These are fantastic achievements about which we can all be proud.

Theory of Knowledge (ToK) 'magic' with Mr Ashok

When reflecting on what makes ABA a unique learning community, it is with an ease that I can find examples which prove that very statement. How many international schools have a 'magician' as a staff member?

My belief that ABA is unique because of the diversity among students, parents and staff was reinforced once again recently.



Mr Ashok, who works in our bookstore has, yet again, shown 'magic' to students at ABA. Our Grade 11 students were introduced to the ideas of knowledge and ways of knowing in the Theory of Knowledge course. In a session on a recent Sunday, Mr Ashok demonstrated that our sensory perception (vision) is truly limited in many ways and that someone with skill could easily make us believe in 'magic powder' from Mr Ashok's pocket. Later, our students reflected on their experience of 'magic' further and discussed limitations we might have when gaining new knowledge and what implications this fact may have for studies in different disciplines. This is, in essence, what ToK is about, critically looking at the knowledge we acquire. In this course we inquire into the process of knowing, rather than learning a specif-

ic body of knowledge. Mr Ashok has helped the students to test the limits of sensory perception as a way of

knowing. Later in this course we are going to explore how other ways of knowing work, and how they work together, both in the context of different subjects and in relation to the individual knower.

An example like this and many others make for so much joy being a part of ABA and working with people from such diverse backgrounds. Needless to say, the session will probably be a highlight of the year for ToK students. 

Season two for Middle School and High School

Season two begins the week of November 4th for MESAC and Middle School teams. Messages via the daily bulletin and email have been sent to the students outlining the first day practice schedule.

We are needing to hire fields for the soccer season. A bus will transport some of the teams to and from ABA to the MQ and Bousher field. Players will need written parental permission given to the coach if they walk home from training at these fields. Parents picking up their child at the fields will need to be at the field before the end of training. If a parent is not present at the field for the end of training, the students will be bused back to ABA. Parental permission is also needed if a student is picked up from the field by another parent.

Soccer players need to ensure they have shin pads, soccer boots, long socks and a water bottle for every training and game. The ABA school socks will be sold from the Booster Club for 3 OMR per pair. Grades 6 - 8 players will need a Blue pair only, MESAC teams will need a Blue and Athletic Gold pair.




