IB Diploma Results and University Placements

For those of you who may not have heard, our students' 2018 IB Diploma results were excellent. In fact, if we were to include one of our long time students who, though graduating from ABA, had to return to his home country in his last semester and took the exams there, the ABA mean would have been 34.7. Unfortunately the IB will credit the other school with his result. In any case, our results compare very favourably with other similar international schools.

Message from the Elementary School

Elementary School Swimming 2019-2018

This academic year will see a change in the Elementary School PE Department, with teachers being responsible for both PE and swimming lessons for a class. This will facilitate a holistic and transdisciplinary approach to learning, with links being made between PE and swimming lessons as well as to the grade level program of inquiry.

The yearly teaching of swimming for Grade 1 to 5 will be broken up into a number of units covering the following:

- Stroke/skill development alternating stroke actions (front-crawl and backstroke) simultaneous stroke actions (breaststroke and butterfly) and water skills
- Water safety personal safety in and around water, basic lifesaving
- Water games tag games, water polo, transferrable games from PE etc
- Movement composition grade 3 to 5 only

K2 (who start swimming in term 4) and K3 will cover some of the above, with a greater focus on water confidence.

You can support your child by ensuring they have the following items on the day of their swimming lesson:

- Swim costume (no bikinis)
- Swim Cap this is mandatory for all students
- Goggles optional but recommended
- Towel

If your child cannot take part in a swim lesson for any reason, please send a note to the PE teacher to clarify this.

Nadia Mustapha Baghdadi has joined the PE department this year. Nadia is from Lebanon and brings with a wealth of experience teaching the PYP and coaching swimming. Nadia will be assisting with the teaching of swimming through all elementary grade levels. Welcome Nadia!

Welcome Back

Discovery Week

All trips must have a CAS focus and over the past two years we have increasing opportunities for discovery here in Oman. Although not yet confirmed we are hoping to be able to offer scuba diving instruction, cooking, an expedition in Oman and an overseas trip to Laos. Providing trips which involve less cost has been difficult due to the price of transport but we continue to try. One additional option this year is for students to self-organise an experience individually or in small groups. Further details will be sent by Ms. Jones and trip organisers in the near future.

Grade 9 Trip

Ms Jones is currently organising our annual Grade 9 outdoor education trip (this was introduced last year). In the same way as Adventure Oman in Grade 8, the aim is for all students to participate. This trip is being planned for February 25th and 26th. Ms. Jones will send a separate communication directly to parents.

AT ABA SCHOOL and has rapidly established itself as the #1 tennis club in the country. University Update for ABA Graduates 2018

Students from the class of 2018 were justifiably delighted with their results, and have now been accepted into a range of world-class universities. Three of our students received and met offers from "top 20 world-wide universities" (according to QS Rankings 2019), Imperial College London, University College London and Edinburgh University. A further nine students will be attending or were offered a "world-wide top 50": University of California, Berkeley; University of California, Los Angeles, McGill University (2), University of British Columbia, The London School of Economics (offer declined) and New York University Stern School of Business (3). This means that over %20 of all ABA students who will be entering Higher Education this academic year, accepted places at institutions ranked amongst the very 'best 50' in the world.

Students generally gained these places with a very high IB points total but the range for these coveted places ranged from 44 down to 32. This means that other factors played a part, such as a compelling personal essays and extracurricular profile (for the US), excellent references, and with regard to Canada, I have no doubt that the reputation of ABA's dynamic and talented students played a large part in the acceptances from McGill, Toronto and UBC. On a college tour of Canadian Universities over the summer, admission offices told me how much they valued ABA students for their rigour and diligence.

As satisfying as those results were, there were many other aspects that were also pleasing amongst this year's diverse graduation plans and destinations. Two of our students were offered scholarships to the University of British Columbia at around the 100,000\$ mark, which is huge compliment to their achievement and potential. Three of our students leave us to study Medicine, a notoriously difficult area for international students to enter into; one student goes on to study Physiotherapy at the same time as training with British Swim Team Coach at Sheffield-Hallam University. Students have chosen challenging courses in the areas of Architecture, Asian Language Studies, Business Administration, Civil Engineering, Economics, English, Electronic and Electrical Engineering, Computer Engineering, Computer Game Design, Finance, Global Development, Hospitality, International Relations, Law, Life Sciences, Neuroscience, the Performing Arts and Political Science. We salute our two students that leave us for military life, one to Austria and the other to Singapore; and we wish our four students embarking on their Gap Years safe travels and experiences as they begin their periods of training, language study and volunteering.

Not all of our students took the IB Diploma, and not all passed. Four students out of the 63 did not take the full IB Diploma, and four, unfortunately, did not quite pass this year (although they each gained 23 points). However, the full Diploma is not essential to being accepted into university. One student was accepted into an outstanding specialist technical university in the US to study Game Design on the strength of his High School Diploma, and one student is going to the University of Calgary with individual IB Courses. Of the four students who just missed passing the IB Diploma, two will take up positions in North American universities despite this, and the other two still have the option of continuing higher education via an introductory foundation route. There are always different ways to get to where students want to be – sometimes it just takes a bit longer to get there!

Overall, ABA students have a great deal to be proud of this year and we congratulate them for all they have achieved!
