# Message from the Superintendent

Our home can be defined in different ways. In its most narrow meaning, we can talk about the house or apartment in which we live. In a wider sense, we can talk about Oman. Here are some facts from the website:

- Head lice are common among young children and their families
- Head lice don't spread disease
- Head lice can be spread from adults to children and back again
- There's nothing to be embarrassed or ashamed about having head lice
- Having head lice has nothing to do with good or bad personal hygiene
- Lice eggs hatch after around 7 days so two applications are always needed to make sure all lice have been killed

Parents are encouraged to support the campaign against head lice by checking their child(ren)'s hair at least weekly, treating immediately, and informing the school. This Once a week, take a peek! Guide for Parents provides information on how to check and treat for head lice.
