A school year runs on a particular cycle which means that from December to about April, it is recruiting season.

It is the nature of international schools that teachers will move. Often, it is the desire to see new countries and experience different cultures that takes teachers overseas in the first place and so it is not surprising that some move on "for a change". Others are looking to further their career with new challenges or responsibilities while for quite a few it is for family or other personal reasons that they choose to leave ABA.

With regards to filling these positions the Senior Leadership Team and I attend international school recruitment fairs. These fairs bring together in one venue as many as 600 candidates from around the world with representatives from about 150 schools. Most candidates have international experience and a good number have worked in IB schools. Today I am writing to you from the first of these, in Bangkok. International Schools Assessment (ISA) results

Parents of children in Grades 3 - 5 will soon receives copies of your child(ren)'s ISA reports. Children participated in these international assessments in October. As we mentioned then, these are not high-stakes tests, but they do provide us with a snapshot of each child's performance at that time, referenced against a 'norm', as well as trends across classes, grades and the school. We use this data in a variety of ways to complement our own internal assessment data and inform us about individual student progress, as well as using the trends identified to reflect on and adjust our instructional programme. Please remember that this data provides only a snapshot of your child's performance. You can learn more about your child's ongoing growth and development through our report cards, Seesaw, or by talking to your child's teacher.



Message from the High School

Happy New Year from the High School!

The new calendar year always starts with a bang in schools, and it's no different at ABA. With Discovery Week for Grade 11, Mock Diploma Exams for Grade 12 and our first full scale trial of the MYP eAssessments all during the week 20th - 24th January, there's no easing into the new Semester – it's light the touch paper and go.

January is also the time for decisions about the future and promises to the self, as we look to make resolutions to improve ourselves and with the best of intentions try to lay off the cake for a month, a week... perhaps a day or two. For students in Grades 10 and 12 it's a time where positive decisions made now will have long lasting effects.

For the Seniors, things are starting to get very real – graduation and leaving ABA cease to be abstract ideas in a distant future – the mock exams bring the real thing, just a short while later, very much into clear focus. For Grades 10 and 12 there is no denying that the next few months are crucial, and will be demanding, difficult and stressful at times. On Tuesday, the High School students hosted TedX Youth, for the second year. As well as impassioned and eloquent speakers and talented musical performances from ABA students, we heard from keynote guest speaker HRH Dr. Mona Al Said who spoke of how change is inevitable and how adversity and difficult times are facts of life that can be a force for the good - for self-betterment and reflection; that if approached in the right way will lead to great rewards, both for the self and society. Message from the PTA


Happy new year and welcome back!
