ELECTIONS FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR 18/19 and 19/20 BOARD

Please bring either your school ID or your Omani Residence Card

If you were not able to attend the 'Meet the Candidates' presentations, click on the a video link here.

To vote, you will check in with your eldest child's first name, your ID will be checked against your name and then you will receive a ballot. Private booths will be available for you to fill out your ballot and then you will place the ballot in the sealed box.

Do not forget, you can also vote via <u>proxy</u> through your spouse if you are not available to vote in person. However, you must fill out the proxy form and bring your spouses ID or copy of the ID.

Voting will continue until May 8th at 2.30pm. The schedule for voting is as follows:

Thursday, 2nd May, 7:00 - 8:00 am and 1:30-2:45 pm Wednesday, 8th May, 7:00 - 8:00 am am and 1:30-2:30 pm

On WednesdayMay 8th, 2019 at 2.30pm, a Ministry of Education representative will be present to open the sealed ballot box and the Election Committee will begin counting the votes in the presence of the Ministry representative. Once the Ministry representative confirms the count, the Election Committee will first inform the candidates followed by an email sent to the community.

The ABA Association is the name given to the entire parent body of ABA. All parents or legal guardians of students at ABA are automatically part of the ABA Association and are eligible to vote.

Message from the Superintendent

Annual General Meeting (AGM)

The Board held the 18.19 Annual General Meeting (AGM) in the Performing Arts Center yesterday evening following a presentation by the Election Committee, speeches by the Board candidates and a short session for the start of the voting period.

Parents heard reports from the various Board Committees and from me as well as a short presentation by our auditors, PwC. Mukhtar Hasan spoke about the new MS/HS campus project. This led into the Finance Committee report that was of particular interest to many. After a very short overview of the current year's numbers, representatives of PwC spoke about the work on the school's 17.18 audit, now approved by the Board. PwC fielded a good number of questions from parents about process and outcome. A presentation on Discounted Cash Flow (DCF), the model used with the auditors to assess the value of our project, was then given by Mukhtar Hasan; this was helpful to many. Following this Neel Bharwadj shared information on the feasibility study undertaken by the consultant branch of PwC as well as calculations to show the viability of the project. Lamya Al Kiyumi, our Board Chair, elaborated on the benefits of the new MS/HS campus, outlining the opportunities for learning and for supporting healthy social and emotional growth. I added that the Elementary School would also benefit with potential new use of space to enhance the learning environment of our students. This was positively received and generated a good discussion about the outlook. To close the evening, Jinane Helou covered the Policy and Planning Committee (PPC) report on the updated policies and by laws passed while I closed the evening with an overview of the academic year through the lens of the School Development Plan.

I left with a feeling that there was general agreement that this had been a good meeting with important points raised and discussed. I'd like to thank everyone who attended for their support and input. I believe that the Board has a good sense of what is needed in order to get agreement for further development.

Flea Market is on 3rd May 2019. This is the last flea market before the summer break! Please contact Evelyn on ptasrep@abaoman.org for your table registration.




RAMADAN FOOD DRIVE
