# Message from the Superintendent

## Message from the Counseling Department

#### **Change in Routines**

Summer vacation brings about change in routines and the possibility of new and exciting experiences through travel and family reunions. As we look forward to the new school year, classes and teachers will alter and new friendships will be formed. For some families, summer also means the inevitable 'goodbyes' that are part and parcel of expatriate life. Over the coming weeks, all students who are leaving ABA will meet with their counselor to help prepare them for their move. For most children/adolescents this is not their first transition; however, it is important to remember that no matter how many times an individual has moved, each move brings about a great deal of change. For our seniors, the move may also incorporate moving to a different country, leaving home and starting university in a new destination.

It is important to remember the children who remain here need the chance to say farewell and affirm the experience that they had together. In-school activities such as class parties, memory books, signed mementoes help both leavers and stayers to celebrate the time they had together. At home you can plan a special activity or experience to mark the transition.

The most important factor in any move is your family unit. The family is the constant in the transition process and below are some ideas to help guide you through. (Adapted from http://www.iched.org)

- 1) Talk about the upcoming move as a family. Allow each person the freedom to ask questions and to express their feelings. Younger children often reflect the attitudes of their parents so it is important to remember that you set the tone for your family. Adolescents may enter a 'silent' stage where they will not discuss the move. Good communication is always important and may need to be even more intentionally encouraged during times of transition.
- 2) Whether you are going to another country or returning home, investigate where you are going and consider how your life will change once you get there. Talk to those who have lived/are living there, research the country or culture. Make plans regarding how to integrate into the new community, make friends or learn the language. Remember that returning to your passport country may feel like going to a foreign country to your children.

- 3) Look for the best ways to keep in contact with the significant people you leave behind. Today's technology has made communication easier, faster, and more reliable than ever. Establish what methods of communication work best before you go so that there is time to create new accounts, exchange mail addresses or numbers.
- 4) Try to maintain the basic elements of your family's regular routine (e.g., mealtime, playtime, celebrations, bedtime rituals, chores, discipline, etc.). This helps provide some stability in times of change.
- 5) Plan to take some familiar things with you and allow your kids to do the same. Pictures and knick knacks can help make your new house a home. A stuffed animal or favorite toy can help your kids adjust to their new surroundings.
- 6) Give each person opportunity and time to say appropriate goodbyes to the people, places, and things that are significant to them. Be prepared for feelings of loss and grief associated with these farewells. Also include reconciliation of hurts or restoration of broken relationships if necessary; it is important not to leave any such "unfinished business" behind.
- 7) Plan for the educational future of your children. Investigate the school options available and the entry requirements at the school you are planning to use.
- 8) Students moving on to university. The majority of our seniors will be moving onto university in a different country in September. It is an exciting phase and as parents we want to make sure they have all the skills and qualities they need to make that transition to life away from home. Spend time helping prepare them for independent living, research their university location, discuss finances and any fears or concerns they may have about moving on. Discuss with your family the impact of this change in family dynamics.

#### **Preliminiary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT)**

ABA will again be offering the PSAT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test) examination to grade 9, 10 and 11 students this coming school year on 16th October, 2019. Mrs. Anthony and I recently had an opportunity to meet with grade 8 students (new to PSAT) to share information about the test, who may benefit from taking it and the sign-up process. Grade 9 and 10 students have been given reminder information in Advisory and by email. The PSAT is not a requirement for any student, however, a beneficial opportunity for any student who is planning to take the SAT in the future and is applying or thinking about applying to the United States for university/or a US university that is based abroad.

This <u>Link</u> <u>provides information on the content</u> of the PSAT examination and will provide information to you and your child.

Additionally, this <u>LINK</u> will provide practice tests and sample questions.

#### **Next Steps:**

Similar to years before, students will register their intent to sit the PSAT exam before the end of this school year. Students who are currently in grade 8, 9 and 10 have received a google sign-up form today (23rd May, 2018). This form will close on 10th June. Please discuss this with your child and encourage them to complete it before the deadline. It is important that all students who plan to sit the PSAT in October sign-up no later than 10th June, as I will need to make the final order of the exam materials by this date. Payment for the exam (approximately 10 Rials) will be collected in September 2019.
