# Kathleen Bowin – Middle School Principal

Kathleen began by thanking the PTA for the money given for the Middle School common room. The middle school common room is now closed and the kids are encouraged to play outside since the weather is so pleasant.

MS Explores: All three trips are leaving next week at the same time. On Monday, students will bring their bags to school. They will be checked to make sure the kids have everything they need and for quick loading the next day. No electronics are allowed and only healthy snacks will be permitted.

There will be a parent coffee morning on Wednesday in the Secondary Library. Cortney parks will be going through library resources. Parents should bring devices as she will also be going through the electronic resources as well.

To conclude her report, Kathleen informed parents that they were getting excited for the upcoming National Day celebrations – there is a lot planned including a special assembly, KAHOOT, traditional Omani performances etc.

# Simon Walker – High School Principal

Simon began his remarks by thanking the Grade 9 and 10 parents for attending the coffee morning and informed those who could not attend, that there will be a summary of the main points in the newsletter.

He noted the tremendous success of the Addams Family production last week and noted that many of the students involved in the production were also heavily involved in other areas; service, sports etc.

Paul gave a quick update on the after-school program;

Elementary – Next season of ASA will be going live the MPSL program has had great success – the kids did very well in the football games hosted by ABQ. The Bench ball tournament will be held on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup>November. Paul encouraged parents to attend to attend not only to understand what bench ball is, but to cheer the students on.

Middle School – season done, all tournaments were completed last week. they did very well achieving many second places. There is a full report in the season in last week's Newsletter. There will be a MESAC email from the Booster Club for the activities happening this weekend. Paul reminded parents that every time there is a MESAC event, it is a Spirit day. This encourages the ABA team spirit. He also encouraged parents to volunteer their time and make food donations this weekend to help the Booster Club.

Paul noted that with about 85 students traveling for MS Explores, it will be a very busy time and thanked teachers for all the preparation they have done.

#### Kendra Glider

Kendra reported that the EC and Elementary had very successful Omani Tree day celebrations with the Eco Rangers having prepared a number of educational activities and videos for students. She also thanked the PTA for a great Spooktacular in the evening. The Goal Setting conferences we very well attended and she was happy to let the parents know that the EC and Elementary are looking forward to a great rest of the semester.

#### Sue Groesbeck – Head of School

Sue began her remarks by letting parents know that in August she asked each faculty member to write down three things they would not change about ABA. She presented those findings and noted that diversity, caring, support, school mission were the most noted by the staff and faculty. She shared that she was very happy with the results because, having done the same exercise in other schools, this has been the most positive report she has ever gotten; which is the essence of the IB program and values.

Spooktacular – not only was it a big event, it was successful and well organized. She noted that what is more astonishing is that when she came on the Saturday morning for a meeting, it was clean and she attributed that to the value that people place in this school.

MESAC – Sue assured parents that the students travelling to India for MESAC will have face masks provided for their health and safety throughout their stay.

She continues to be in contact with Craig Williamson and she has planned to spend time with him and introducing him to the leadership and giving him the information and insight he will need coming in.

She also thanked Turinada and JP who are instrumental to the success of all the events the PTA hosts.

Sue responded by letting parents know that once the new campus is ready and is in use, that will open up space on the current campus. There will be renovations made and more activities can be made available.
