## BILLS BEAT KIRKWOOD

The Junior Bills shocked 4th ranked Kirkwood 35-0 last Saturday. The Bills' impregnable defense allowed only 62 yards total offense, shutting out their third opponent this season.

The game was actually more exciting than the score implies. The Bills had scored only one touchdown with 13 minutes left in the game. Tom DeCaro bulldozed through two Kirkwood defenders on an 18 yard run for the first quarter TD. Kirkwood never sustained a good drive, but three times the Kirkwood quarterback overthrew receivers who were open and could have gone for touchdowns.

The final 13 minutes were completely dominated by the blue and white as they scored four touchdowns in that time. DeCaro scored the second touchdown on a 20 yard passing play from Tim Gibbons. Matt Shocklee was the next scorer on a 6 yard run. Mike Detwiler threw to Terry Owens in the end zone for a two-point conversion. The reliable SLUH defense set up the fourth touchdown when Terry Owens recovered a fumble at the Pioneer 25 yard line. Three plays later, Mark Finney scored from four yards out. Don Behan completed the scoring on a five yard run.

This Saturday the Bills take on Webster Groves. Formerly ranked #2 behind the Bills, Webster was upset 21-20 by Ladue last weekend. Saturday's game will be at Webster, game time, 2 p.m. Tickets must be purchased at the gate for \$1.00.
